Dear Parents

This Sunday we celebrate one of the most important feasts of the Church's year: the Ascension of Jesus into heaven. Since the festivities of Easter, we have had a period of forty days in which we have been thinking about all the different ways in which Jesus has kept his promise of being with us 'always', to the end of time when we all will be reunited with him in Heaven. This period of 40 days is itself symbolic of our life's journey. Our faith ensures us that He will be with us at every stage of our earthly and eternal life ever after. The feast of the Ascension reminds us that the goal of our life is the same as our Lord's. We and all those whom we love are called, like Jesus, to enjoy a united communion with God forever. Though our Lord is no longer physically present with us on Earth we are all united with him through prayer, faith and love. Through the sacrament of Reconciliation, Fr Michael Fallon MSC reminds us that: We have a place where we can always find him ready to forgive, heal and encourage us. In Communion we are taken into heaven for a few moments and are given a taste of the communion with God and with all whom we love, which will be our eternal home. Finally as the season of Easter draws to a close, we recall Jesus' promise: 'I will come again and take you to myself so that where I am, there you may be also' (John 14:3).

The Working with Children Check is a <u>three step process</u> which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Both the CEO Module and the NSW Working With Children Check must be completed to finalise your clearance.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
- an authorised carer
- a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email with a WWCC Number which states that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.
