
Our Spring Fair is a chance to celebrate as a community and to welcome visitors to our home here at Christ the King. Our success is dependant on us all working together.

After lunch we made mud bricks by mixing mud and water and pressing the mix into a wooden mould with our hands. Our hands got so cold and dirty! (Luke Milic)






Next we threw ourselves frantically into a tent building competition, girls versus the boys. Naturally the girls won. The judge was a woman! (Alex Bozanic)





When it was over we cooked our first damper by roasting it over a campfire. It was the best thing ever I have ever done but not the best thing I have ever eaten. (Lauren Saab)








