

### NO – Sewing Necessary

#### Materials

- Plain Calico material Approximately 2 metres, depending on the height of your child. About \$4 a metre, available from Spotlight, near the curtain section.
- Approximately 1 ½ metres length of cord.
- Large tea-towel or similar material for head covering.
- Head band or thick elastic to secure head covering.

#### Pattern

- Measure the head to be in the centre of the material. The material should hang evenly both back and front.
- Cut a small hole for the head. The head should slip through snuggly.
- Tie the cord around the waist. The sides do not need to be sewn.
- Tea-towel or appropriate material goes on the head and use the head band or elastic to secure the head covering.
- Wear the costume to school on the night of the concert. Wear plain shorts and t-shirt under the costume with plain sandals or white shoes.
- No thongs or brightly coloured shoes please.
