COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE: INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The compulsory years of schooling

Did you know that if a student misses as little as eight days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed over a year of education?

In New South Wales, all children from six years of age are legally required to attend school or be registered for home schooling. After they complete Year 10 and until they turn 17 years of age, students then have the following options. They may also be in:

- •full-time further education and training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship);
- •full-time, paid employment of an average of 25 hours per week; or
- ·a combination of both of the above.

Children are expected to attend all school activities, on time. Regular attendance helps your child:

- •develop the skills needed to access and enhance their learning
- •to learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- •make and keep friendships.

What if my child has to be away from school?

If your child has to be absent from school, you **must** tell the school and provide a reason for your child's absence. To explain an absence parents and carers are required to:

- •send a signed note to the school, or contact the school via electronic means such
- •as fax or email, or telephone the school, or
- •visit the school.

or

EXTENDED ABSENCES/STUDENT LEAVE FOR REASONS OTHER THAN ILLNESS

If you are aware that your child will need to be away for a day or for an extended number of days and this leave is not due to illness but e.g. family holiday, then an Application for Exemption from Attendance at School will need to be completed. These forms can be obtained by contacting the school office at least 2 weeks before the planned leave. Supplying work for students on extended absences is possible but not always practical given that children need to be present for the learning cycle and instructions etc. Please discuss suitable activities if needed with your class teacher.

CTK YEAR 3 - YEAR 6 DIARY USE

The Year 3-Year 6 school diary is used as a communication book, if using a pre-printed sick note from this diary, please ensure it is signed and your child advises their teacher when they return to school after an absence.

A handwritten note signed by a parent/carer on the child's return to school.

This absence note is compulsory as an Audit requirement for the Class roll.

A small number of absences may be accepted by the principal. For example, if your child has to:

- go to a special religious ceremony
- •is required to attend to a serious and/or urgent family situation (e.g. a funeral)
- •is too sick to go to school or has an infectious illness.

What are school Principals responsible for?

Principals help to ensure the safety, welfare and wellbeing of your child. Principals have to keep accurate records of student attendance and the reasons for any absences. Principals are responsible for accepting or not accepting a parent's explanations for their child's absences. Principals may request further information from parents for long or frequent absences, even where they are explained by parents as being due to illness.

When absences are unexplained by parents, or the explanations are not accepted by the principal, the school will work with parents to help address the issue. The main aim is to sort out what is preventing the child from getting to school and putting strategies in place to help. Sometimes, the school will ask support staff and other agencies to assist.

SCHOOL FEES 2015

Please see below School Fees schedule for 2015. Details of school based fees, sibling discounts and the Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee are included for your information.

Flexible Payment Plans School Fees accounts will be sent home via the post on Wednesday 11th February and are due on Friday 6th March 2015. For your information, in addition to normal payment plans, Flexible Payment Plans are now being offered to all Schools.

The Flexible Payment Plan is an alternative to our current payment terms of 30 days and offers families choice to pay their annual fees in part payments over a six month term from March to August (Standard Plan).

Full details and application forms for this payment plan will be enclosed with your Term 1 School fees account.

Diocesan Tuition Fees Schedule 2015

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fee can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is only charged for the first three (3) children currently enrolled in the diocese (in other words there is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the diocese or other participating Catholic schools - see 'Sibling Discounts' below). To work out how much the fee is for each child, check the table below.

Diocesan Building Levy

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2015 is \$702 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$234 payable in terms one, two and three.

Annual Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee

The Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee for 2015 is \$1,731 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$550 in terms one, two and three. The fee applies to new students on the following Visa numbers: 173, 401, 411, 416, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 457, 459, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Christ the King: School Based Fees 2015

RESOURCE FEE

We have an annual resource fee per child which assists the school to budget for the materials and resources used for the children's benefit. The 2015 fee is \$175.00 and is reviewed each year. The classroom items covered by this charge include paint, brushes, cardboard, art paper, craft materials, recreational reading books, Mathematics equipment and paper. Computer software and supplies also receive an allocation. Additionally this fee also provides the children with text books, exercise books, pencil cases, music folders and other stationery items that are required for the year.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

CTK's focus is on developing Technology throughout the school. This process involves the purchase of laptops, maintenance and software etc. There is an annual Technology fee of \$75 per family, This fee appears on your Term 1 account.

EXCURSION / INCURSION FEE

We have an annual excursion / incursion fee of \$55 per child which assists the school to budget for these events. The fee is reviewed each year. This fee covers all excursions and incursions e.g. Life Education, Book Week speakers etc. for the year and appears on your Term 1 account.

CARNIVAL FEE

We have an annual carnival fee of \$30 per child which assists the school to budget for our Swimming and Athletics carnivals. The fee is reviewed each year. This fee covers all carnivals for the year and appears on your Term 1 account.

Other CTK Fees for 2015

Other CTK school curriculum activities which incur fees include Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Surf Education, Sports in Schools Australia (Term 1) and Dance Multisport (Terms 2, 3, 4), and camps etc. These activities vary from year to year.

SCHOOL CENSUS DAY NEXT FRIDAY, 13th February, 2015

NEXT Friday, 13th February is School Census Day. All children should attend school on that day and absence should only be if it is absolutely necessary.

If your child is absent on Friday 13th February, a note explaining the child's absence must be presented to the school teacher on the child's return on Monday 16th February.

This is of course a requirement that applies to everyday of the school year, however, Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education.

LIBRARY NEWS

Premier's Reading Challenge 2015

After another successful reading year in 2014, we are once again registering all students for the 2015 PRC. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. Over the next week your child will be given their Personal Reading Log sheet to record to record the books they have read. In the meantime, jot down the title and author of any books that your child is reading or that you are reading to them to be added to the log when it is issued. More details to follow.

Over the holiday all students where invited to borrow ebooks from the mobile Wheelers eplatform. As this ebook library is still being introduced and tested please email the school with your experience of using the app over the break (northrocks@parra.catholic.edu.au - Subject line Wheelers ebooks Mrs Cook). Instructions for downloading and using the Wheelers platform is below.

CEDP eBooks through Wheelers Now you can continue to read all year round by accessing and reading eBooks!

The Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta has subscribed to the eBook provider Wheelers. This means that you can borrow and download ebooks on any mobile device (using the ePlatform app) or any laptop or computer (you need to create an adobe account) from school or home.

PLEASE NOTE - THE BOOKS IN THIS LIBRARY HAVE BEEN SELECTED BY A TEAM OF EDUCATORS FOR K - 12 WHICH MEANS THAT YOUR CHILDREN CAN ACCESS BOOKS THAT ARE SUITABLE FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS. THIS IS NOT UNLIKE VISITING A PUBLIC LIBRARY, AND LIKE MANY OPPORTUNITIES FOR LEARNING AND ENTERTAINMENT, STUDENTS ARE TAUGHT AND EXPECTED TO USE THE RESOURCES RESPONSIBLY. Please read the following carefully before letting your children access the ebook resource.

- 1. Our student ebook platform provides opportunities for our students to access ebooks that have been specifically selected for K12 by a team of educators.
- 2. Supervised use of this ebook platform at school and at home provides an environment where students can learn about book selection, encourages wide reading and opportunities for school and family discussion about literature.
- 3. This modelling then will help our students when they are accessing other ebook platforms at local libraries to select books that suit their interest and reading age.
- 4. Parents should use the opportunity to share the ebooks with their child and discuss any themes, characters or issues that their child may struggle with either due to reading age or topic.
- 5. At school, students sign an Acceptable Use Policy of Technology which reminds students that they should not access material meant for people in older age groups and they should also tell their teacher if they come across something inappropriate.

Students along with the guidance of teachers and parents should

- 1. Talk with their teachers or parents about books they wish to download.
- 2. Look at what age group the book is intended for.
- 3. Read the description of the book and categories it comes under to see if the topic suits their interest and their age.

The Student eBook platform provides information on the 'interest age' of a book as well as a description, categories, type of text (young adult or children's fiction etc) and other information that can be used as a guideline for students to see if this book is suitable for them. Scroll down the page of the selected book to find this information.

Access eBooks on a Mobile Device

- 1. In the app store download ePlatform by Wheelers (you need to do this once on each mobile device)
- 2. When you first open the app tap on Find your library
- 3. In the search bar across the top type Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta and tap on the link. You will now be in the ebook library for CEDP and using your student username and password can borrow and download books
- 4. On the top right is a search bar where you can search by author, subject etc OR by scrolling down the page you can browse resources by category (fiction, picture book etc)
- 5. Remember, like in all libraries, an ebook you wish to read may be checked out!
- 6. Once you have found a book to read tap on the cover. You can know scroll down the page to check the suitability of the ebook
- 7. Tap on the green link Login to borrow this title
- 8. Use your school network
- a. username (first initial of your christian name and your surname, some students have a number following) and
- b. password (a series of letters and numbers that are case sensitive)
- 10. Once you have logged in tap the borrow now link and your ebook will download ready to read.
- 11. If you are already logged in, tap the Read now link and the book will appear on your shelf. Tap the ebook to read.

Students are able to borrow three books at a time for a period of two weeks. If you finish your book and wish to return it before the two weeks is up, go to your shelf. Once in shelf tap the shelf link again. This will take you to a page where you are able to return the book.

Remember if you share a device with your family at home, you must log off the app when you finish reading for the day (it is easy to logon each time you wish to read and the app remembers your place in the book!). This will ensure that younger brothers and sisters can not read books that are too old for them.

REMEMBER TO SHOW YOUR PARENTS OR TEACHER WHAT BOOK YOU HAVE CHOSEN SO THAT THEY CAN SHARE THE ENJOY-MENT OF READING WITH YOU.


NOTE - You can also borrow and download eBooks from Wheelers through our school based library catalogue on both mobile devices, laptops and desktops. The library catalogue is found through our school website ctknorthrocks.catholic.edu.au under the Learning & Teaching tab, Holy Faith Library tab. There are two issues with this

- 1. You must create an adobe account first to enable the background software to download the book. You must be 13 years of age to create an adobe account. Once the account has been created it applies to all users of Wheelers on that device or machine.
- 2. On a mobile device, the eBook opens in DL reader which often has suggested books to download and read. THESE BOOKS ARE NOT THROUGH WHEELERS AND THEREFORE HAVE NOT BEEN FILTERED BY THE CEDP. ON THE POSITIVE SIDE YOU ONLY GET A SAMPLE OF THE TEXT.

CHILD PROTECTION—CEO PARRAMATTA MODULE & THE NEW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK



The Working with Children Check is a three step process which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Roads & Maritime Service (RMS) Office (formally RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Completion of only the CEO Module will not allow you to assist in the classroom

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
 - an authorised carer
 - a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the RMS check has been completed you will receive an email which will state that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of the RMS email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.
