TEACHER / PARENT INTERVIEWS have begun and will continue next week (except for Year 5). A reminder that report meetings are 15 minutes long. Please ensure that you are on time to enable the teachers to keep to their appointment timetable.

It has been wonderful to receive compliments from parents regarding their particular child's teacher after having met in partnership with them at the parent interviews. This is especially refreshing given that the workload of a teacher is often criticised by the media and perceptions of a '9 to 3' day are still present. In comparison our teachers spend the '9-3' part of the day with the children facilitating their learning. Countless hours aside from this time are then spent each day correcting and assessing the student's work (this term in particular has seen teachers meeting to analyze children's work-samples, results and assessments against criteria linked to our syllabus to ensure a correct E-A achievement level) planning lessons, preparing resources, meeting with support teachers to discuss children's needs, professional development to continually improve the quality of their teaching, regular meetings with parents to discuss children's progress, staff meetings, organizing excursion opportunities, carnivals, whole school events and many many more while, at the same time, juggling their own family lives and finding time for reflection and self renewal.

My appreciation and thanks to you as parents, for your valuable role as the primary educators of your child and to the teachers, a dedicated team of professionals who give so generously of their self, skills and time.

My thanks also goes out to all the members of the Fete committee who are busy organising the many attractions and stalls for our CTK Spring Fair. It is wonderful to see so many positive and hard working members rallying around to ensure a successful and exciting experience for all. Thankyou to the many volunteers who are running the various components of this annual event, together we will make 2015 another successful year of building community and raising funds for Christ the King. I especially wish to thank Kylie and Rita for their tireless co-ordination, they are doing a truly awesome job.

Internet Privacy

With the internet becoming more prevalent in our lives, it is important to understand that there is a digital footprint being created for all of us. While our teachers are constantly reminding students of appropriate use of technology, diligence at home is vital to keep your children safe. In communicating student achievements to our community, your children's names may be printed in the school newsletter which is published each week on our website. As this is a public site, these details are searchable on the internet.



Christ the King is taking the following steps to minimise your child's digital footprint:

- ⇒ It is school policy that new student enrolments complete a 'Consent form for audio, video, photography and work' and a similar consent form has been used for our primary students over the years. You are asked to notify the school if you do not wish to have your child's audio, video, photo or work published in the newsletter or on the website.
- ⇒ Only a student's first name and first initial of their surname will be used when they are acknowledged in some way in our newsletter or on the website.
- ⇒ We have purchased Skoolbag, a mobile application which you can download onto your phone. This will facilitate a more efficient and 'private' form of communication with our parent community. Although the app is not password protected, it is also not searchable on the web. More details about Skoolbag next week.




