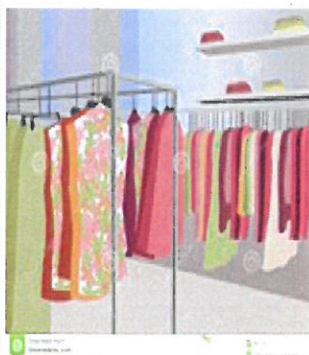

### Recipe of the week

### Chocolate Chip Cookies



#### Ingredients:

200g butter softened  
1 1/2 cups brown sugar  
2 eggs  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 cups self raising flour  
2 cups chocolate chips

#### Method:

1. Preheat oven 180 degrees C
  2. Cream butter and sugar until pale and creamy.
  3. Add eggs and vanilla beat well.
  4. Fold in flour then choc chips.
  5. Place spoonfuls of mixture onto trays. Make sure to leave space between biscuits as they spread quite a bit in the oven.
  6. Bake 12-15 minutes
  7. Allow to cool on tray 5 minutes before moving to cooling rack.
- \* the softer the butter the more soft and chewy the biscuit will be.

### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The process of initiation for children into the parish community of the faithful is celebrated in three sacramental moments: Baptism, First reception of the Eucharist and Confirmation. All children (whether they attend Catholic or State schools) in our parish, prepare for the sacraments of First Reconciliation (Year 3), First Eucharist (Year 4) and Confirmation (Year 5/6) in a program that is **parish based** (not school based) and **family centred**.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a prerequisite for First Eucharist (for children in Year 3 and above) and will begin with a Parent Information Evening to be held in our parish church on **Thursday, 3<sup>rd</sup> September**, commencing at **7.30pm**. The program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important for parents/guardians to attend this meeting.



## Tournament of Minds 2015

Last Sunday, 23rd August 2015, our Tournament of Minds team competed in the Sydney West Regional Finals at the University of Western Sydney, Kingswood Campus. Monday saw our annual book week parade move to the hall. What a wonderful event. The students enjoyed dressing up as their favourite book characters or famous inventors.

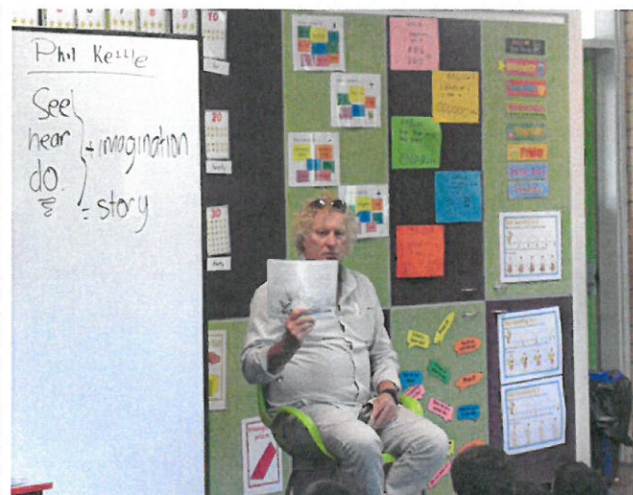

# Author Visit - Phil Kettle

On Tuesday, students at Christ the King were excited to meet famous Australian author Phil Kettle. Phil Kettle has written over 160 books including the Too Cool, Boyz Rule and Girlz Rock series. The students got an insight into how Phil Kettle plans and writes his stories resulting in many budding writers wanting to get published straight away!



On Tuesday 25th August, Phil Kettle came to visit CTK. Mr Kettle spoke about his childhood and told us how he decided to become an author.

Mr Kettle shared with us important tips on how to write a great story and the importance of imagination. When he was young people always asked him what he wanted to be when he grew up, he said he wanted to be lots of things but one of them was an author.

Mr Kettle was so funny he told us that his favourite time of the day when he was at school was home time because he was the only boy in his class and it also meant he got to go home and play football. He said he used to get dressed and look in the mirror and imagine he was an AFL player the best one there ever could be. His backyard was his imagination place where he could be anything he wanted, no one told him what he could be and couldn't be.

Mr Kettle said that he loves being an author and that his Too Cool series were his favourite books because they are all about his childhood. He inspired us to be amazing writers and maybe even authors when we grow up. Thank you so much Mr Kettle for coming, for inspiring us and helping us to become better writers.

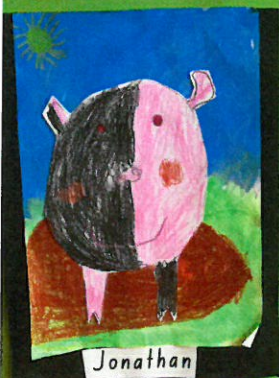
