Dear Parents

As the Church's liturgical year draws to a close so does the Gospel focus on the writings of St Mark. In his Gospel this Sunday, Jesus is questioned by the disciples regarding the end of time, the end of the world - the end of man's occupation of the earth. Jesus says very little in reply to their inquiries, redirecting the disciples to focus on how they have lived their lives. As the liturgical year draws to a close let us pause and take stock of our own lives. We may ask ourselves, are we living a life highlighted by the Gospel values exhibited in our relationships with others or are we too self-centred and focused on worldly possessions? Let us reflect on this question as we come into the season of advent in the next few weeks, reflecting on our lives, repenting for our wrong doings and opening our hearts to the love of God our Father.

This evening our year three children from both our school and wider parish community will receive the gift of healing through the sacrament of Reconciliation. For the very first time our young boys and girls in a formal way will seek Gods forgiveness for the times they have failed to do the right thing. As a community let us pray for them as they continue to receive God's unconditional love and forgiveness and as they continue their journey with Christ our Lord. Thanks to the Parish Sacramental team [of which Miss Vella is a valued member] for the many hours they have given in preparing both the children and the parents for this most important sacrament of healing. The team is to be congratulated and thanked for their efforts over the last few months.

It has been brought to my attention that people are parking under the COLA of a morning when dropping students off at the COSHC. After 8:15am of a morning there is to be NO parking under the COLA as it is obstructing the drive through as parents drop off their children. As supervision does not commence until 8:15am no children should be dropped off before this time unless they are going to COSHC. Parents picking up children in Burradoo Close of an afternoon are asked to ensure they are supervising their children in the cul-de-sac as several children have been reported to be playing on the road and surrounding footpaths whilst parents are in deep conversation. The safety of our children is paramount and the responsibility of us all. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Our Kindergarten students and their teachers are off on excursion to Calmsley Farm tomorrow. We wish them a safe and an enjoyable day whilst consolidating their learning and experiencing farm life first hand. Tomorrow also sees our senior band touring on the road to several schools throughout the Sydney metropolitan area. They will begin the day under the COLA performing our annual demonstration concert for children in years 2-5. We trust Mr Lavis and his musicians will have a great day.

Finally parents are reminded that siblings of students of the children who attend the Thursday afternoon after school Dance Fever session are not to be left to their own devices whilst the session is being conducted. These non participating siblings are not supervised and are the responsibility of their parents and NOT the Dance Fever staff. Your co-operation in this matter will be appreciated

Dear Christ the King Families.

A few Sunday's past we heard in the Gospel of Mark the story of Bartimaeus, an outcast, a beggar on the outskirts of Jericho. A man calling out for help... for pity.

Then Bartimaeus heard a question that he may never have heard before:

'What do you want me to do for you?'

Currently there are over 200 children in detention on Nauru calling for our help and pity.

The Human Rights Commission's Forgotten Children report into children in detention provides evidence that is both shocking and shameful.

The reporting has been consistent. Children are being harmed and the trauma they are experiencing may be carried well into their adult life.

As people of Christ's love and compassion, surely we should step in and not let this happen to any child in pain?

Christ the King Primary will be joining other schools from across the Parramatta Diocese to support the children who are currently in detention across Australia by "Jumping Up & Down 4 Kids". We will be "Jumping Up & Down 4 Kids" by jumping to Jacinta Gulisano's song "Jump" (www.youtube.com/watch_popup?v=uqj69vnhzkE) at 12:00 pm on Friday November 13, 2015.

Christ the King Primary will be jumping to name that as a Catholic community we will not standby and let immigration detention happen to children. Parents who have given permission to the school earlier this year (on the Annual School Consent Form to be photographed) will participate and be photographed "Jumping Up & Down 4 Kids" in their classrooms. If you do not want your child to be photographed, please email Mr Tony Hughes on ahughes@parra.catholic.edu.au to inform him of your wishes.

We encourage you to help get the message out that we are calling for the release of all children from immigration detention. It is time that we all jumped up and down to end indefinite mandatory immigration detention for children.

CHILD PROTECTION—CEO PARRAMATTA MODULE & THE NEW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK



The Working with Children Check is a three step process which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Completion of only the CEO Module will not allow you to assist in the classroom

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
- an authorised carer
- a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- 3. Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email which will state that you have clearance to work with children. You will need to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. Only then will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE SCHOOL OPAL CARD

The Minister for Transport and Infrastructure and the Minister for Education has announced the launch of the new School Opal card. The School Opal card has officially launched its new online application for relevant parents and students travelling in the Opal public transport region. The application can be found at transportnsw.info/school-students

Just like current paper travel passes, the School Opal card gives eligible students free travel to and from school on school days. However, the School Opal card makes travel simpler, because now students don't need multiple application forms and passes if they use different transport operators within the Opal network.

Students with school travel passes this year will not need to apply for a School Opal card unless they are changing schools, campus, their home address or moving from year 2 to 3 or year 6 to 7.

Those students who do not need to apply will have a School Opal card sent to your school for the beginning of the first term in 2016.

Information to CTK students already holding a bus pass has been sent home.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.





For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.



For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Windows 8.1/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"

2016 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2016 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2015 and Term One in 2016.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2016 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au. This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2016 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by your child's school**. MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSW PSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the N.S.W. P.S.S.A. Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection.

Please note the following information:

- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This
 may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.
