Dear Parents.

Vesterday we celebrated Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent. This significant season in our church's liturgical year is a time of reflection, penance and prayer as we prepare for the events of Holy Week and the celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. At both our mass and liturgy yesterday we were reminded that over the next forty days we are invited to be more loving and generous with our time, our talents and material possessions, in pursuit of making a difference in the lives of others. Let us reach out to others and search for that face of Christ in everyone and be that compassionate and understanding person that will make a difference in the lives of those we meet each day. During this first week of Lent let us pray that God will breathe his life into us again, as he did to Jesus, and draw us into the embrace of eternal life.

On Tuesday you would have received a letter and email regarding a meeting that will be held on Tuesday 23rd February in the school library to discuss the future structure of the CTK Parents and Friend's Association. This will be an open forum for all interested parents to voice their thoughts and discuss how the Parents and Friends Association can best serve the needs of our community. I encourage all parents to attend the meeting and join in the discussion on the future direction of this most significant parent group.

In recent times I have been asked to explain the selection criteria for the Hills Shire Council School Citizenship Award [Yr 6], the Rotary Club Citizen Award [Stage 3] and the Lions Club Citizenship Award [Yrs K-6] that are presented annually at the end of year school presentation. The selection process is a collaborative process amongst the Christ the King Staff. Students nominated for these awards are children who have consistently displayed effective school leadership among their peers, maturity, responsibility and initiative within the school community as well as being students who display a positive school spirit. They are also students who may be quiet achievers who are pro-active yet humble throughout the school year. As you can imagine making a decision on these three major awards is difficult as there is always a substantial number of candidates to choose from.

Tomorrow is Census day for all schools across the state. This data-gathering day is a significant process that assists in the distribution of state funding for our schools. The data collected forms the basis of Recurrent Per Capita grants provided to the Diocese each year by both the Australian and State Governments. Part of the process involves schools providing a head count of the student population and details of students absent tomorrow regardless of the reason for their absence. Students are expected to be at school tomorrow as is the expectation each day. It is most important that if your child is absent from school tomorrow you must follow this up immediately on Monday next week with a written explanation for their absence.

I look forward to catching up with you all at the Parent / Teacher information evenings next week.

This is of course a requirement that applies to everyday of the school year, however, Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education.

Please take the time to read the relevant information on the MSP Photography payment envelope and remember these helpful points:

- For the convenience of families we are having early morning family photo sessions between 8am-8.45am in the Hall. Family photos will continue during the recess and lunch periods. We ask that you let your children know if they are having a family photo to avoid confusion on the day. If you bring your children for this early session they are under your supervision until morning duty begins at 8.15am.
- EVERY CHILD MUST HAVE THEIR OWN ENVELOPE ON PHOTO DAY even if they are not ordering a photo package.
- <u>DON'T</u> seal envelopes inside each other for more than one child. You can pay for all children in one envelope (please indicate this on the envelopes) however each child must have their own envelope on photo day.
- <u>CORRECT PAYMENT ONLY—NO CHANGE WILL BE GIVEN</u> Cash, cheques and money orders only on the day. Please note: the school office does not hold cash and therefore will not be able to supply <u>any</u> change.
- Credit card payments can be made online (please follow instructions on envelope) or by calling MSP Office staff prior to photo day. Your child will still need to take their envelope with them on the day.
- Parents are asked to ensure that children wear their full school summer uniform i.e. no jewellery, maroon hair ribbons, neat hair, no nail polish, no make-up, practise smiling.
- <u>Family Photo envelopes</u> (siblings only at school) are available from the office upon request.
- Please ensure your child has their OWN photo envelope with full correct payment (and Family Photo envelope if applicable) ON THE DAY.

COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

- 1-9 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date.
- 10-100 days absence: Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

2016 Diocesan School Fees

Dear families

As you may be aware, there is still uncertainty around long term government funding for Catholic schools. Indications are that federal government funding for education post 2017 will be linked to the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which historically has been much lower than the education inflation rate. Funding growth linked to CPI will not meet increases in the real costs of schooling.

To maintain our current service levels we will need to increase diocesan tuition fees by 5%. This increase will mean we can continue to fund important initiatives to improve student learning, including:

- literacy and numeracy programs such as Focus160, Reading Recovery, EMU, EM4 and professional learning for teachers and leaders to support the implementation of these programs
- increasing support for students with disabilities, behavioural and emotional needs
- improving our learning spaces, technology and infrastructure
- building new schools and expanding existing schools to cater for new places

Scholarships and fee arrangements We are committed to ensuring that no child will be refused enrolment due to a family's financial situation. There are a range of scholarship and support programs to assist families including:

- The Bishop Manning Scholarship Fund
- Fee arrangements and discounts
- The Byallawa co-contribution scheme for Indigenous families

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fees - 2016

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fee can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Terms 1, 2 and 3. Flexible payment plans are also available around weekly, fortnightly or monthly payments. The fee is only charged for the first three children currently enrolled in the diocese. There is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the diocese or other participating Catholic schools.

Annual Diocesan Building Levy - 2016

The Diocesan Building Levy enables us to continue to maintain all schools to a high standard, and ensure we can expand or build new schools in high growth areas. To ensure this continues we will need to increase the building levy by \$33 per family per year. The levy for 2016 will be \$735 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$245 in Terms 1, 2 and 3.

We continue to make every effort to contain educational costs and we do not take the decision to raise fees lightly. If a school fee increase will be difficult for your family to manage, please contact your school principal. We will provide every assistance to families in financial need.

Annual Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee

The Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee for 2016 is \$1,815 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$605 in terms one, two and three. The fee applies to new students on the following Visa numbers: 173, 401, 411, 415, 416, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 457, 459, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Christ the King: School Based Fees 2016 RESOURCE FEE

We have an annual resource fee per child which assists the school to budget for the materials and resources used for the children's benefit. The 2016 fee is \$200.00 and is reviewed each year. The classroom items covered by this charge include paint, brushes, cardboard, art paper, craft materials, recreational reading books, Mathematics equipment and paper. Computer software and supplies also receive an allocation. Additionally this fee also provides the children with text books, exercise books, music folders and other stationery items that are required for the year.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

CTK's focus is on developing Technology throughout the school. This process involves the purchase of laptops, maintenance and software etc. There is an annual Technology fee of \$80 per family, This fee appears on your Term 1 account.

P & F Fundraising Levy

In December, 2015 the Principal wrote to the CTK Parent Community about the need for a different approach to fundraising in our school.

Over the years the Christ the King P & F has worked tirelessly on the social and fundraising aspects of the Association, with equal emphasis on both - Social events to grow our CTK Community and Fundraising to support and enhance the educational opportunities of our children. It was proposed at that time that the P & F Association change its focus from fundraising to social. This would then enable the primary work of the Association to focus on activities that help build our school community. The P & F Association would continue on with this vital work, organising special events, social occasions etc.

With this change of focus there arose the need to address the shortfall in our fundraising. To address this issue a Fundraising Levy of \$120 per family was proposed. The response to this proposal was positive.

We have therefore this year introduced the \$120 Levy (per family) with the payment being split over three Terms - i.e. \$40 per term.

We thank you for your consideration and support of this proposal, not only in relation to the change in our fundraising process, but the continuing support of the important work done by the Christ the King Parents and Friends Association.

EXCURSION / INCURSION FEE

We have an annual excursion / incursion fee of \$55 per child which assists the school to budget for these events. The fee is reviewed each year. This fee covers all excursions and incursions e.g. Life Education, Book Week speakers etc. for the year and appears on your Term 2 account.

CARNIVAL FEE

We have an annual carnival fee of \$30 per child which assists the school to budget for our Swimming and Athletics carnivals. The fee is reviewed each year. This fee covers all carnivals for the year and appears on your Term 2 account.

Other CTK Fees for 2016

Other CTK school curriculum activities which incur fees include Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Surf Education, Sport in Schools Australia (Term 2) and Dance Multisport (Terms 1,2 & 4) and camps etc. These activities may vary from year to year.

To assist with your family's budgeting a number of the school based fees have been charged in equal instalments over Terms 1, 2 & 3. Fees include:

The Year 5 Camp, Dance Fever Multisport and the P & F Fundraising Levy.

The Year 6 Canberra Excursion is charged in full in Term 1. However, with the reduction in the duration of the excursion (2 days rather than 3 days) and the application of the PACER Rebate, the cost has been reduced by approx. \$100 in comparison to 2015.

Christ the King continues to make every effort to contain education costs and provide effective payment arrangement options.

Should you find you are experiencing financial difficulties, please do not hesitate to contact the Principal, Mr Hughes to discuss your family's financial situation.

The Working with Children Check is a three step process which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Both the CEO Module and the NSW Working With Children Check must be completed to finalise your clearance.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: **www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au** and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
- an authorised carer
- a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email with a WWCC Number which states that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.


