RESPONSIBLE USE OF TECHNOLOGY—Agreements

Premier's Reading Challenge 2016

Once again in 2016 all students at Christ the King will be entered into the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge. This is a fantastic opportunity to encourage consistent reading for your children. Please see the next page for an introductory letter explaining the basic rules for the challenge. You can also visit the web site for more information.

EVACUATION PRACTICE

Christ the King Primary School practiced an evacuation drill from classrooms, library, sports and office areas on Tuesday. This drill is a compulsory component of our emergency procedures and is held to ensure that all our students and staff know the appropriate emergency response and are kept as safe as possible in the event of a fire.

Students were informed of the evacuation drill and had an opportunity to discuss the drill with their teachers before and after the event.

Students were reminded that it was only a practice and not to be alarmed when the announcement of an evacuation is made.

Premier's Reading Challenge

This year Christ the King will be registering all of our students for the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). This is a wonderful opportunity for you to encourage your child's reading and for your child to experience a variety of quality literature throughout the year. Students will have a reading log in their message folder, the back of their homework book or in their diary to keep a personal ongoing record of books read. The PRCID is the most important section to complete as this is the code you will use to enter your child's reading log onto the PRC website in Term 3. We ask that parents sign each entry once a book is finished, books read in class will be acknowledged by the class teacher. Although the Holy Faith Library has many of the books on the PRC lists, please visit your local libraries for extra books. - The Challenge runs from 7th March to 19st August 2016. Ongoing reading is encouraged.
- Students must complete a set amount of reading to meet the Challenge, see table below:

Challenge	Number of books needed to complete the Challenge	Minimum number of PRC books for your Challenge	Maximum number of personal choice books	PRC booklist selection
K-2	30	25	5	K-2, 3-4
3-4	20	15	5	3-4 , 5-6
5-6	20	15	5	5-6 , 7-9

- Independent K-2 readers should attempt the 3-4 Challenge.
- To experience a book your child can listen to the book, participate in a shared reading of the book or read part or all of the book independently.

Privacy Information

It is a condition of entry that all students entering and successfully completing the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive an official PRC certificate and their names may appear on the PRC Gold and Platinum Honour Roll. Schools registering students must ensure that a parent/caregiver understands that all students entering the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive a PRC certificate and appear in the PRC Gold and Platinum Honour Roll. The certificate shows the student's name and school. Only the students' name will appear in the Gold and Platinum Honour Roll with no other identifying factors. Participating schools appear as a separate list and home-schools are not listed individually.

PASSWORDS will be issued at the beginning of Term 3. Until this time please use the Personal Reading Log at the back of your children's homework book, in their message folder or in their diary to record the title, author and PRC ID number of each book read. The PRC ID number can be found either on the title page of the book or from the PRC web site under book list.

It is parent's responsibility to ensure that each child's reading log is entered onto the official PRC website by the closing date of 19th August, 2016. Please watch for updates in the newsletter.

- Students, whose online entries are received by the closing date of 19th August, 2016 will have their certificates sent to school in Term 4.
- Students who complete the Challenge for four years receive a gold certificate., for seven year receive a platinum certificate.

Android Users

Chess News Primary Schools Chess teams Competition 2016

The NSW Junior Chess League's Primary Schools Competition is a teams competition for primary schools throughout New South Wales.

Matches are scheduled on a home-and-away basis and are usually played on Fridays after school. The competition starts in second term and the divisional rounds conclude by early in third term, with the finalists progressing after that (into fourth term if they continue to be successful).

Students must be able to play chess to enter.

Teams of four can only be entered into this competition with parental involvement. One parent for each team of four must supervise the home game and drive students to opposition schools on a roster basis. Parents must have a current Working with Children Check.

The Working with Children Check is a three step process which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Both the CEO Module and the NSW Working With Children Check must be completed to finalise your clearance.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.


2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
- an authorised carer
- a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email with a WWCC Number which states that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.



Here are some tips for parents to keep your child safe online

BE SAFE

- Be aware of how your child uses the internet and explore it with them
- Set rules and monitor to make sure your child knows what information they can share or post online and which websites they can visit
- * Teach your child to tell a trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable about something they have found on the internet or received in an email
 * Discuss with your child the importance of

keeping personal information private. This sort of

information can be used to identify or locate

where they live, go to school or activities in which

they are involved

BE RESPECTFUL

- * Talk to your children about cyberbullying. Online communication should be responsible and respectful
 * Children and adolescents who are being cyberbullied sometimes change their behaviour. If you are concerned they might be a victim of cyberbullying, talk to them and tell them you are concerned. Arrange to talk to a teacher or school counsellor
- * Advise your child not to respond to any negative messages and to keep evidence. Tell them to report any negative messages they receive to you or another trusted
 - * Children and their parents can contact social media companies and ask for defamatory material to be taken down. If the material is not gone within 48 hours, a complaint can be lodged with the Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner at www.esafety.gov.au

BE RESPONSIBLE

- Consider using inbuilt filters and controls on your digital devices and home network to manage your children's online access. Keep your virus protection up to date
 - * Talk with your child about being careful when downloading files or clicking on links. Some files or links may be harmful viruses or trying to obtain personal information
 - Certain online activities (downloading illegal videos or music, plagiarism, sexting, identity theft, 'hacking' networks) are illegal and can result in criminal charges


