Dear Parents.

This Sunday we celebrate the third Sunday of Lent and are focused on the importance of repentance in our lives. Our faith has taught us that Lent is a time of reflection, penance and renewal. The reflection is about us examining our own conscience and determining how we need to change. Our penance and renewal revolves around how we choose to change our lives with the help of God our Heavenly Father. The Gospel for this Sunday highlights the parable of the Barren Fig Tree. This parable is very closely linked to Jesus' teaching on repentance and renewal. The story of a barren and fruitless fig tree reveals it requires more time, sunshine and water to produce fruit of a high quality. We too as children of God need to be patience and use our time wisely to produce our best in the way in which we grow and develop. At all time through these years of growth we are nourished by the unconditional love, grace and mercy bestowed upon us by God himself.

Dear parents,

Writing is a sophisticated but integral skill for your child in their learning.

Our school curriculum states:

Students become literate as they develop the knowledge, skills and dispositions to interpret and use language confidently for learning and communicating in and out of school and for participating effectively in society. Literacy involves students listening to, reading, viewing, speaking, writing and creating oral, print, visual and digital texts, and using and modifying language for different purposes in a range of contexts (Australian Curriculum).

Becoming literate is not simply about knowledge and skills. Certain behaviours and dispositions assist students to become effective learners who are confident and motivated to use their literacy skills broadly (Australian Curriculum).

To develop out student's communication skills in 2016 we are placing a high importance in writing. Christ the King is focusing its strategic direction in literacy through the medium of writing for different purposes and contexts.

BECOMING A WRITER AT CTK

You can support your child by:

COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

- 1-9 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. As this leave is under 10 school days, you may presume that this leave is approved unless otherwise contacted by Mr Hughes.
- 10-100 days absence: Parents must complete and submit the <u>Application for Extended Leave</u> form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application). If approved the Principal issues a <u>Certificate of Extended Leave</u>. If the principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

The Working with Children Check is a three step process which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Both the CEO Module and the NSW Working With Children Check must be completed to finalise your clearance.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
- an authorised carer
- a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email with a WWCC Number which states that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.
