Dear Parents,

In St Luke's gospel this Sunday we are told of the story of Jesus' encounter with the women accused of adultery by the Pharisees of the time. This story highlights our Lord's ability to forgive and be the example for us to ask for repentance and grant forgiveness for those who harm, insult or commit wrong against us. The message conveyed by Jesus through this recount is that we need to stop and think before we criticize or condemn others. Jesus is asking us the following: Do we know this person? Do we know their circumstances? Are we criticizing or condemning the person or their actions? All these questions aside, Jesus is encouraging us to forgive and help those who have done wrong against us or others to repent and change and be a better person for the experience.

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This week we celebrate Catholic Schools Week (CSW). This week of acknowledgement and celebration involves the communities of all Catholic primary and secondary schools across NSW and the ACT. The theme for 2016 is **I Belong. You Belong. We Belong.** which aligns with the Catholic Church's strong focus on supporting refugees and asylum seekers and the need for a compassionate global community. The theme also ties in with the Catholic Church's celebration of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, which centres on pardon, strength and love. Tomorrow, we will celebrate with a liturgy on the bottom playground from 9am followed by morning tea and the opportunity for our new prospective parents to CTK to tour the school with our year 6 student guides. We look forward to celebrating with you tomorrow morning.

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Over the last week families were emailed the 2016 Responsible Use of Technology agreement. This agreement needs to be discussed with your children and completed online by next Monday 14th March. Students whose agreements are not finalised by this date will not be able to access the technology in the classroom. Your prompt attention to this matter will be greatly appreciated.

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Thank you for your understanding with the postponement of our Cross-Country carnival yesterday. Due to the ongoing hot weather that we have been experiencing, the cross country has been postponed until after Easter. The event will now be held on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> March [W10]. We anticipate cooler weather at this time. On this day students will be selected to represent CTK at the Diocesan carnival early next term.

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Thank you to those families who have supported the Diocesan World Youth Day raffle. All monies and tickets sold or unsold need to be returned to school by tomorrow Friday 11th March, as all money and ticket butts need to be delivered to the Diocesan office by next Monday.

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Earlier on this week each family received information and a volunteer form regarding the formation of new committees to organise and facilitate the various social events that take place at CTK throughout the year. The aim of this volunteer drive is to spread the workload across all of our families and to get people involved in the social side of school life here in our parish and school communities. It would be appreciated if these volunteer forms could be returned to school by next Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March. Thank you.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

In accord with the Parramatta Diocesan policy, we will be conducting the parish-based, family centred, school supported method of preparation for children eligible to receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion.

Children in Year 4 and above are eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion provided they are baptised and have made their First Reconciliation.

In the parish of Christ the King, the Sacrament of First Holy Communion will be celebrated at the parish masses on the weekend of 28th/29th May (the Feast of Corpus Christi).

The program for preparation to receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion will commence with an information meeting for parents/guardians on Wednesday, 16th March commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

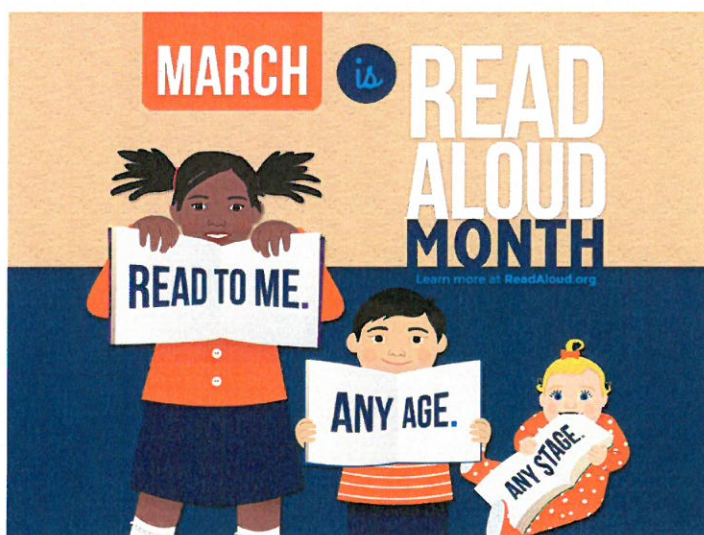
Premier's Reading Challenge 2016

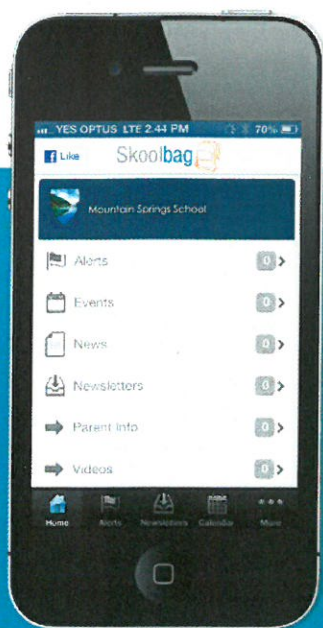

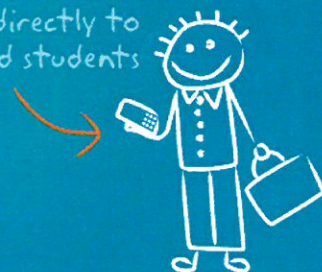

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

iPhone & iPad Users

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.



Android Users

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

The Working with Children Check is a **three step process** which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Both the CEO Module and the NSW Working With Children Check must be completed to finalise your clearance.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at :

<http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au>

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Potential adoptive parents
- Authorised carers
- Adults who reside in the home of:
 - an authorised carer
 - a family day care service provider
 - a home-based education and care service provider.

3. Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email with a WWCC Number which states that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.

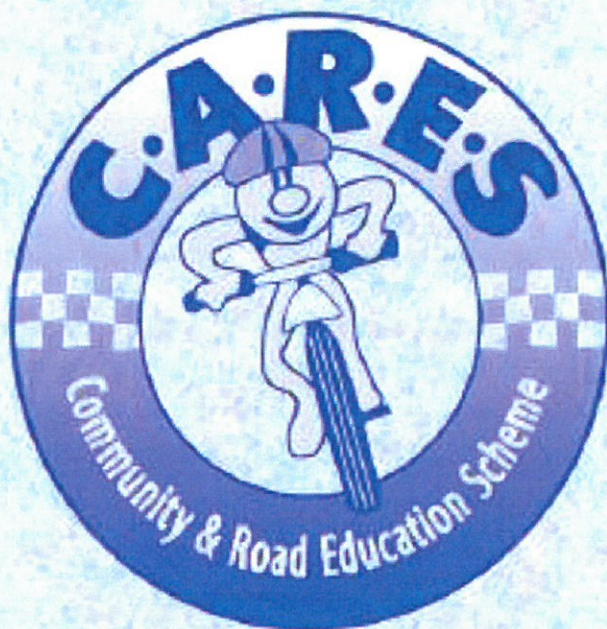
