Dear Parents

Welcome back to school for the start of Term 2. I trust you enjoyed the break with your family and friends and the beautiful Autumn weather. As we commence a new term, take the time to sit down with your children evaluate their efforts for last term and set a few simple learning goals for the next ten weeks. As we move into the next few weeks of the term students will be completing various assessments in order for teachers to compose Semester One Reports.

'If you love me you will keep my word, and my Father will love you, and we shall come to you and make our home with you' (John 14:23,27). These words so beautifully expressed in this Sunday's Gospel encourage us to reflect on the loving relationship we share with Our Heavenly Father. God is inviting us to share in the love which is God's very own life: the love that is given by the father, the love that is received by his children, the love that is the union of the God with us all. The truth is that God is a communion in love, and God wants to grace us all by drawing us to an intimate sharing in this communion. It is of the very nature of God to keep offering love. Fr Michael Fallon MSC suggests that nothing we have ever done, nothing we could ever do, could change that. What we are asking is that we might remember this offering and open our hearts to receive it, and keep on offering ourselves to be loved.

Students in Years 3 and 5 will sit the NAPLAN examinations during week three of this term. The literacy and Numeracy tests will run from Tuesday 10th-Thursday 12th May with results and reports being available to schools and parents mid term 3. This year, NAPLAN has been aligned to the Australian Curriculum: English and the Australian Curriculum: Mathematics. Items in the tests will be based primarily on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year. As in previous NAPLAN tests, a small percentage of additional content from the year of testing and following year of testing will be included. This is to ensure the range of items in the test allows all students to demonstrate their capability.

Late last term I had the great pleasure of accompanying our year 6 students and their teachers on their field trip to Canberra. Following a term of studying democracy, federation, the country's various levels of government and our Australian electoral protocols, our senior students consolidated their learning by visiting our Australian capital city. Over the two days we visited Parliament House, The Australian Electoral Education Centre, Questacon and the Institute of Sport. Our Year 6 young men and women proved to be worthy ambassadors for our school, through they way they behaved and interacted amongst themselves and those with whom they met over the two days. A special thanks to Mr Matthews, Miss Brady and Mrs Hermens who gave of their time to organize and attend the trip over the two days. Congratulations and thank you to all concerned.

In order to celebrate The Western Sydney Wanderers participation in this Sunday's A-League Grand-Final against Adelaide, students who are supporters of the Wanderers will be allowed to wear their Wanderer's supporter shirts and stripes over their uniforms tomorrow {Friday}. We wish the Wanderers the very best as they seek their first premiership this weekend.








We spent some time in the tomb of the unknown soldier, viewing the various exhibits and hearing stories of fallen soldiers. To finish off our visit we participated in a moving last post ceremony, where our two school captains Juliette and Anthony, laid a wreath beside the pool of reflection.







After dinner, our day continued with a guided tour of the **Australian Institute of Sport**. Year 6 loved the activity centre where they were able to test their abilities against the best, playing games that tested their skills in jumping, running speed, chin ups, rowing, shooting and more!









On Friday morning we woke up bright and early for a 6:30am breakfast followed by some outdoor games, before packing up and getting back on the bus for another big day. We took a walk to look at the **National Flags Display** before visiting the **Electoral Education Office** at Old Parliament House. Here, the students learnt about the electoral process in Australia and held a mock election for our favourite fruits.

Our trip came to end with a visit to **Questacon**, where the students explored every level in great detail, particularly

enjoying the level dedicated to spiders of all kinds and having a go at the infamous freefall.

After two event filled days and many hours on the bus, we arrived back to school on Friday night. Well done to all our Year Six students, who were thoroughly engaged and motivated throughout the two days, demonstrated their knowledge of Australian Democracy whenever quizzed and asked thought provoking questions at every turn.

The Working with Children Check is a <u>three step process</u> which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Service NSW Office (formally RMS/RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Both the CEO Module and the NSW Working With Children Check must be completed to finalise your clearance.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

The Working With Children Check is FREE. Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
- an authorised carer
- a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian check has been completed you will receive an email with a WWCC Number which states that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of this email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.
