Dear Parents

This Sunday we are celebrating the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. We are remembering with gratitude and celebrating with joy Jesus' gift to us of his Body and Blood. To give our body and blood for someone, is another way of saying that we love them with 'our heart, mind, soul and strength' (Mark 12:30). In celebrating this feast day, we think of Jesus. He gave his body for us. He poured out his life for us. He gave himself, day in and day out, to teach and to heal, to comfort and to challenge, to forgive and to love. In a thousand practical ways, he gave himself to us, showing us what it means for God to hold us in existence. Jesus gave himself for us, making the ultimate sacrifice of his life. He loved us when it was easy and he loved us when it was hard. In giving himself - his body and blood - for us so convincingly, he revealed to us that, whoever we are and whatever we have done and wherever we have been and whatever others may think of us, God loves us and wants us to live and to live to the full.

This weekend our Year 4 students in the parish will be making their First Eucharist across all parish masses. Everyone is invited to join these children and families in celebrating this most significant event in the lives of our first communicants. Over the last month or so the children have been preparing with their parents for this special occasion. Many thanks to the Parish Sacramental team, the group facilitators and all those involved in preparing the children to receive Jesus through the Blessed Eucharist for the first time. Please pray for these children and their families in anticipation of this special day in their lives.

Thank you to our hard working band of Year Six Mums who organized the sausage sizzle last Thursday. Thank you to all our families who supported this Year 6 fundraising initiative. A lovely lunch was provided for all with funds raised to support the end of year Year 6 graduation celebrations. Thanks to all concerned.

A special thank you to all our families for returning your children to school in Winter uniforms this week. Our students look great in their uniforms. Our Kindergarten children were very proud to be wearing their new uniform for the very first time. Please ensure that all boys wear the school tie correctly and that their shirts are tucked in. It is also important the girls are wearing their tab tie as it is part of their winter uniform. PARENT INFORMATION NIGHT

Wednesday 15th June, 7-30pm in the Church

In the parish of Christ the King, the sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred on Wednesday, 24th August, 2016, commencing at 7.30pm. In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy we will conduct a parish-based, family centred, school supported method of preparation for the children to receive this sacrament.

It is a prerequisite that children to be confirmed will have already received First Holy Communion. Children who were baptised in Eastern Rite (Uniate Churches, e.g. Maronite, Melchite, Ukranian, Chaldean etc.) may have already been confirmed at Baptism and will not need to participate in this programme.

Children in grade five or above are eligible to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

The preparation programme for Confirmation will commence with an information meeting for parents/guardians on Wednesday, 15th June, commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY ALL PARENT VOLUNTEERS INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK. This new form must be completed online by the end of Term 2.

From Term 3, parents who have not completed this form (regardless of if they have a current Working With Children Check) will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school.

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. **It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form** that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

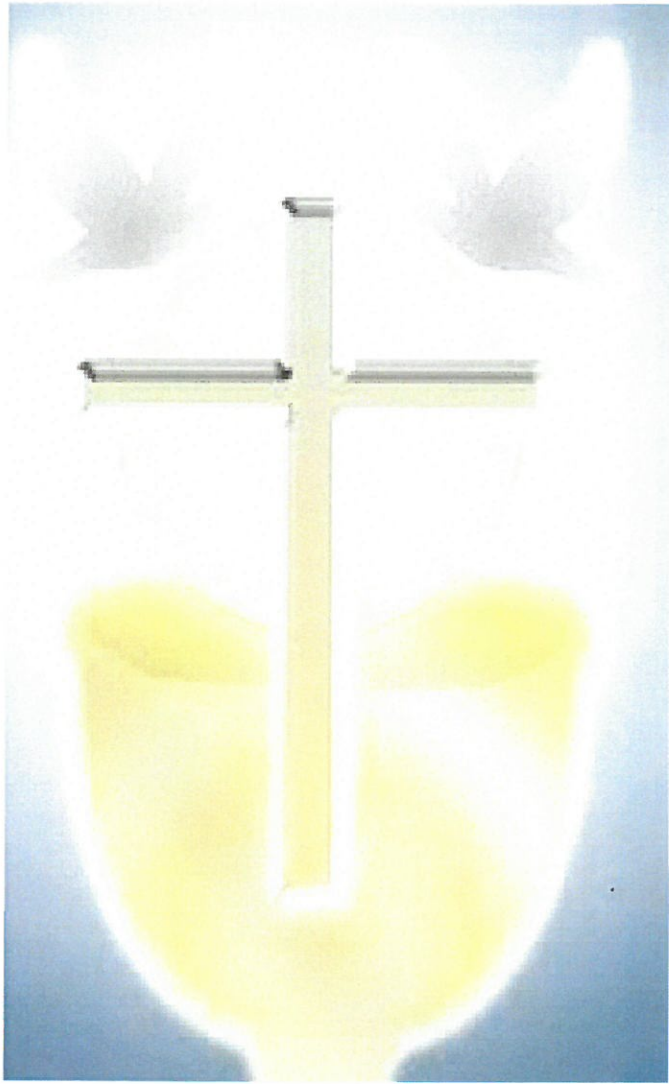

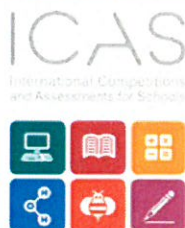
