Dear Parents

The theme of this Sunday's Gospel reading is life. In Luke's Gospel account, Jesus comes upon a funeral procession and a mother weeping for her only son. Moved with compassion, Jesus restores the boy to life and to his mother. There are three valuable insights into the gift of life shared in Luke's writing. The first is that God our father is the source of all life and all living creatures. Secondly an individual must humbly allow God to transform one's life. St Paul throughout his Gospel revealed that God transforms our lives at three levels: from the human to the divine revelation, from persecution to proclamation and from good works to grace. St Luke's third and final insight into the gift of life is that consolation and comfort should be at the centre of our lives. As we reflect this Sunday on the Gospel reading, let us ponder on the following two questions: "How do I look at life?" Do I allow God to transform my life?".

Please remind your children if they have a lunch order and where it is in their bag. Please be advised that lunch orders will not be filled after 10am on the days they are made available. Parents will be contacted to arrange lunch for their children. If parents cannot be contacted the children will receive Salada crackers with cheese or vegemite and a box of sultanas organised by the school. Your assistance in this matter will be greatly appreciated.

Changes to going home arrangements. Children should be fully aware of their going home arrangements before they come to school each day. Changes in going home arrangements, if absolutely necessary, must be phoned into the school before midday. Messages received after this time are passed on with much difficulty due to assemblies, and classes being held at various places on the school grounds. Please note that for your convenience children that are not collected by 3.15pm are sent to the Office and should be collected at the latest by 3.30pm. Children remaining after this time will be sent to COSHC. If you feel that collection of your children will regularly be after the final school bell at 2.55pm, please consider registering your child / children into COSHC.

As part of showcasing our children's learning we will be reintroducing Assemblies. Assemblies will be on designated Friday afternoons from now till the end of the year. The assemblies will commence at 2pm and will run for some 20-30 minutes. For the remainder of 2016, each grade will present their learning at one of these assemblies. Our Year 6 leadership team will host and run these assemblies which will include Scripture and Prayer, Acknowledgment of Country, our School Song and most importantly an opportunity for the children of the designated grade to share and showcase the learning that has taken place leading up to the assembly. Parents are invited to attend these assemblies and share in the great learning that is happening in our learning spaces each and every day. Awards will continue to be presented at the recess assembly on Friday mornings so the focus can be on showcasing our student's learning. Our first assembly will be hosted by Year 3 tomorrow Friday [3rd June] afternoon commencing at 2pm in the hall. We look forward to seeing you then.

The last week has been a busy one for our CTK sporting teams. We have had the stage three boy's and girl's soccer gala day and the NSW State Primary Rugby sevens events. Congratulations to all our students who have represented CTK at these days. A special thanks to the staff and parents who have given of their time to coach and support these children. Well done to all concerned!

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

PARENT INFORMATION NIGHT Wednesday 15th June, 7-30pm in the Church

Confirmation

In the parish of Christ the King, the sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred on Wednesday, 24th August, 2016, commencing at 7.30pm. In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy we will conduct a parish-based, family centred, school supported method of preparation for the children to receive this sacrament.

It is a prerequisite that children to be confirmed will have already received First Holy Communion. Children who were baptised in Eastern Rite (Uniate Churches, e.g. Maronite, Melchite, Ukranian, Chaldean etc.) may have already been confirmed at Baptism and will not need to participate in this programme.

Children in grade five or above are eligible to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

The preparation programme for Confirmation will commence with an information meeting for parents/guardians on Wednesday, 15th June, commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

A message from the Executive Director of Schools—CEDP Greg Whitby

Radical Funding Freeze proposal

Government and non-government schools deserve to be appropriately funded to ensure they achieve high quality outcomes for every student in every school.

The Centre for Policy Development's radical proposal to freeze funding for low fee Catholic schools would threaten parents' right to choose a faith-based education for their child.

Every student deserves a base level of educational funding in Australia. A funding freeze would put pressure on school fees at a time when many families in western Sydney are already struggling to make ends meet. Many parents who send their child to a Catholic school in western Sydney make big sacrifices to pay school fees because it is the best fit for their child's educational needs and religious preferences.

Catholic schools receive government funding because they play an integral role in providing education in the community. In western Sydney, Catholic schools educate one in four students. Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta is one of the largest employers in western Sydney with over 5,000 staff. A funding freeze for low fee Catholic schools would not only have an adverse affect on our students and their families, but also our teachers and staff, local business and wider community. It would also put more pressure on the State government to cater for new public school places.

Students and families should not be disadvantaged for choosing a Catholic education for their child. We need to stop pitting non-government and government schools against each other and allow diversity and choice for families in the type of education they want for their children.







In Religion we have been learning about the Emmaus Story and considering the feelings of the Apostles when Jesus rose:

PARENT VOLUNTEERS WITHIN THE DIOCESE OF PARRAMATTA

New directive from the Diocesan Office 25th May 2016

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

This new form must be completed online by the end of Term 2.

From Term 3, parents who have not completed this form (regardless of if they have a current Working With Children Check) will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school.

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).



You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module which can be found at this link.

This information was advised in your confirmation email towards the bottom of the page and can be easily missed. The link provided in your confirmation email from the Child Protection Team Catholic Education Office Parramatta was incorrect. Please use the abovementioned link.

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

Therefore in brief:

- 1. To complete form go to: http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au
- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email go to the link above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.
