Sr. Catherine will depart for Ireland late next week. Thank you to all those who assisted in making last Sunday a most memorable celebration for Sister Catherine and her fellow Holy Faith Sisters.

Thank you to those parents who have already attended their Parent Teacher Interviews. These most valuable meetings will continue next week. #### **Healthy Harold - Life Education Visit 2016**

Once again this year the Life Education Unit with Healthy Harold will be visiting CTK. Life Education aims to 'empower our children and young people to make safer and healthier choices through education'. Infant classes will have one hour sessions while our Primary grades visit for 1 1/2 hours. The van will be here in Week 1 Term 3 Tuesday 19th July through to Monday 25th July. There will be a parent session on Monday 25th July at 2.00 pm for anyone interested is finding out more about the Life Education program. Below is a brief outline of the focus for each year group.

Kindergarten - Harold's Surprise. Healthy food choices, importance of physical activity, safety.

Year 1 - Harold's Mystery Tour. Body workings, safe use and storage of medicines, peer pressure and coping strategies, safety, decision making.

Year 2 - Harold's Heroes. Environmental health issues, emergency procedures, individual needs for medicines and safe use and storage.

Year 3 - Harold's Diary. Friendship, resilience, expressing emotions, coping strategies, healthy food choices, active lifestyles.

Year 4 - bCyberwise. Explores cybersafety through animation, vox pops of chidren relevant scenarios, discussion and problem solving.

Year 5 - It's Your Call. Definition of legal drugs, decision making, emotions, peer pressure, risk taking, problem solving, safe and appropriate use of communication technologies.

Year 6 - Think Twice. Consequences of alcohol use and misuse, stay safe situations and refusal skills, laws controlling purchase and use.

#### **EXPLAINING THE SEMESTER 1 SCHOOL REPORT**

Dear Parents and Caregivers

Semester 1 Reports have been sent home and Parent / Teacher meetings have begun.

Kindergarten report grades are based on the 3 domains of working towards, working at and working beyond.

Please find below an explanation of the grading system for Year 1 – Year 6. It is important to remember that students receiving a C grade have indicated they are working at grade level / Stage outcomes. To receive an A or B grade indicates that the student is working beyond grade level / Stage outcomes, demonstrating thorough to extensive knowledge of the in-class studied content.

Stage outcomes cover two grades over two years – with exception to Early Stage 1 that covers Kindergarten only. Stage 1 covers Year 1 and Year 2, Stage 2 covers Year 3 and Year 4 and Stage 3 covers Year 5 and Year 6. This means the Curriculum outcomes allocated to each stage are expected to take a duration of 2 years to achieve.

#### A

#### **Excellent Achievement**

The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

#### B

#### **High Achievement**

The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and has a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

#### C

#### Sound Achievement

The student has sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

#### D

#### **Basic Achievement**

The student has basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of achievement.

#### E

#### **Elementary Achievement**

The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

Comments are written for students' strengths and areas of need for the Key Learning Areas of Religion, English and Mathematics. These comments are derived directly from the content descriptors listed in the NSW Australian Curriculum documentation. There is also be a Personal Behaviours for Learning (PBL) focussed general comment given for every student.

History has been the area of focus in classrooms for HSIE in Semester 1; therefore all students will receive a History grade. In Semester 2 the focus will be placed on Geography and students will receive a Geography grade in the Semester 2 reports.

The whole school areas of focus for Creative Arts in Semester 1 have been Visual Arts, Music and Drama. Students will receive a grade for each of these areas based on their involvement with in-class Visual Arts and Drama activities, Wakakirri participation (if applicable) and Music lessons with Mrs Collignon. The Semester 2 reports will focus on the Creative Arts domain of Dance.

#### **FEDERAL ELECTION BRIEFING 2016**

To the School Community of Christ the King North Rocks,

With the federal election on 2 July fast approaching, education is again a key issue for the major Australian political parties.

Both the Coalition and Labor parties have committed additional funding to schools. It is important that prior to the election, Catholic Education engages with both major parties to advocate for the needs of our students in Western Sydney.

In the coming weeks Very Rev Peter G Williams, Rev Fr Christopher de Souza and myself will be meeting with our local Labor and Liberal candidates to outline the issues for Catholic Education in the Diocese of Parramatta.

Our key messages will include:

- ⇒ Sustainable, sector-blind, needs-based funding for schooling K-12
- ⇒ A permanent commitment to funding universal preschool access for 15 hours per week for three and four year olds
- ⇒ Support for flexible partnerships and pathways between industry, community, tertiary education and schools
- ⇒ Support for out of school hours care as part of a continuous schooling experience
- ⇒ A national focus on collaboration across sectors and sharing good practice rather than competition and test scores
- ⇒ Government investment for innovative schooling models to respond to growth through capital and seed funding.

I encourage your school community to speak with their local candidates about their education policies to be better informed.

Please be reminded that all Catholic schools and schools authorities are charities and as such are regulated by the Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission (ACNC). Under the ACNC regulations, schools cannot support a particular party, ask its parents or staff to vote for a particular party or distribute materials in support of a particular party or candidate.

#### **Athletics Carnival**

The Athletics Carnival will be held NEXT FRIDAY, 1ST JULY at Sydney Olympic Park Warm-up Arena (Edwin Flack Avenue, Homebush Bay).

PLEASE NOTE: All students participating in the 800m or that are colour house captains must be at school by 8.00am to meet Mrs Roberts & Mrs Ritchie on the basketball court on Friday for early transportation to the Athletics Carnival. **The bus will not be waiting for any late comers**.

At Christ the King we believe that all students, their families and staff have the right to be a part of a safe and supportive athletic environment. Therefore all staff share the responsibility of our school athletics carnival to foster participation, enjoyment and encourage positive involvement.

Our School Athletics Carnival takes into account the NSW Board of Studies syllabus as well as in accordance with the requirements set down by the Combined Schools Athletics Committee. This is to make sure our selections for the Combined Carnival are accurate.

To maximize participation students will also participate in tabloid activities continuously throughout the day. The aim of the day is to hold a carnival with a race meet embedded in to this.

Parking is available in the P1 & P2 areas (P2 is the best area), just follow the signs to Athletics parking. Parking fees are as follows: First 4 hours free and then \$5 per hour thereafter (max \$25). <u>Parking tickets must be validated at the Kings Sports Store.</u>

All children will be travelling to the venue by bus and <u>must be at school by 8.45am</u>, as we would like to have the first bus boarding immediately after the school bell. Buses will be leaving at 9.00am.

800m competitors will need to be at school by 8:00am as their bus will be leaving at 8:15am sharp (please note that this bus will not be able to wait for students who arrive late).

The children need to dress in their school sports uniform. They may also wear a t-shirt in their house colour and may add some item of coloured clothing, e.g. a ribbon (please dress children in appropriate clothing for the weather). No paper streamers and/or coloured zinc are to be brought along and children are not permitted to spray their hair or use any paint.

Each child needs to bring enough healthy food and fluids to last the day. The children will not be permitted to use the canteen facilities. Neither will parents be permitted to purchase food from the canteen for their children. Please pack healthy snacks and water.

All parent helpers need to report to the official table at 8.45am. All helpers will be given a fluoro vest. To ensure smooth running of our carnival we request that only those parents with a vest be on the field during the day.

Please note that all events taking place on the sports field will be in full view of the parent seating in the grandstand.

At the completion of the day (approx. 2pm) you may take your child home with you. It is essential that you see your child's class teacher before taking your child. Any children who have not been collected by a parent at this time will return to school by bus with their class teacher. We will return to school in time for the children to return home in their usual manner.

A last minute reminder note will be coming home next week.



#### BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> <u>ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

This new form must be completed online by the end of Term 2.

From Term 3, parents who have not completed this form (regardless of if they have a current Working With Children Check) will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school.

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

**Volunteers** – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <a href="http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au">http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au</a>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).



#### You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

#### A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module which can be found at this link.

This information was advised in your confirmation email towards the bottom of the page and can be easily missed. The link provided in your confirmation email from the Child Protection Team Catholic Education Office Parramatta was incorrect. Please use the abovementioned link.

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.
