Over the last week our CTK community has had many opportunities to celebrate great achievements by members of our school community. We look forward to our children performing again showcasing their musical and dancing talents. Last Friday our students performed most admirably at the Diocesan Athletics carnival with several children being awarded age champion or runner-up on the day. Finally congratulations to our three Year six students Juliette Hughes, Samantha Emeish and Elizabeth Ozer who represented CTK in the Voice of Youth Cluster final last Monday. A special acknowledgement to Juliette who was awarded the Social Justice Medal for her speech titled "Black and White". Let's acknowledge and celebrate the efforts, talents and achievements of our students in our school community each and every week.

On Wednesday afternoon the 14th September [Week 9] I would like to hold a parent forum to discuss school issues pertaining to the teaching and learning at CTK, new initiatives and future planning, acknowledge achievements and successes as well as provide an opportunity for parents to ask questions and raise topics for discussion. If this initiative proves successful we will seek to invite guest speakers to attend workshops with topics pertinent to parents and their children's education. My intention is to endeavour to run these gatherings once or twice a term in place of the now defunct Parents and Friends meetings. I will vary the times to accommodate parents who work of a day. Online games of this nature have age restrictions placed upon them because of the content and the age of the those chatting online. I would encourage all parents to be diligent in regards to monitoring your children's online activities whether it be with online games or chat rooms. Issues arising between children that happen "online" outside of school are not the school's responsibility to solve. Too many incidents happening outside of school hours online are being brought to bear at school, when they could be avoided if parents would be more diligent in monitoring their children's online home activities. Please take the time to make it a priority to be aware of what your children are doing online. Your assistance and co-operation in this matter will be greatly appreciated by staff and all members of the school community.



Dear Parents,

Recently you may have noticed that there is no longer a lost property area located outside the school staffroom.

After some data collection it was found that in this area:

- The majority of items had names
- Food scraps were being left there in lost lunch boxes causing a hygiene concern
- When sorting and cleaning this area this was taking up valuable learning time

CTK's PBL team concluded that lost items in the lost property bin, were not being collected by students due to its out-of-sight location.

Over the past 2 months CTK has trialled not having a lost property bin. To date, the number of lost items has decreased. Any named items found around the school are now being returned to students at assembly time.

NEW LOST PROPERTY PROCEDURE

Any lost unnamed item will be being placed under the pin-up board which is in front of the Kindergarten classroom. The items will be left there for one week only. On assembly days, Year 6 leaders will remind the students to check if any of the lost items belong to them. After that time, clothing items will be sent to the second hand clothing pool and unclaimed lunch boxes, drink bottles and other items will be disposed of.

We hope this information will help our community understand the importance of caring for their property and belongings.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The process of initiation for children into the parish community of the faithful is celebrated in three sacramental moments: Baptism, First reception of the Eucharist and Confirmation.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a prerequisite for First Eucharist (for children in Year 3 and above) and will begin with a Parent Information Evening to be held in our parish church on **Wednesday**, **7th September**, commencing at **7.30pm**. The program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

All children (whether they attend Catholic or State schools) in our parish, prepare for the sacraments of First Reconciliation (Year 3 and above), First Eucharist (Year 4 and above) and Confirmation (Year 5/6 and above) in a program that is **parish based** (not school based) and **family centered.**

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important for parents/guardians to attend this meeting. Children are not required to attend this initial meeting.

This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-10 days) must be emailed to the Principal. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*
- For Family leave over 10 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> <u>ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).



You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module which can be found at this link.

This information was advised in your confirmation email towards the bottom of the page and can be easily missed. The link provided in your confirmation email from the Child Protection Team Catholic Education Office Parramatta was incorrect. Please use the abovementioned link.

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email go to the link above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.


