Dear Parents

This Sunday's Gospel features the parable of the Dishonest Manager. The theme of this parable revolves around what are the genuine riches an individual attains in one's life. Jesus speaks of shrewdness and foresight exhibited by the steward in the parable in dealing with a critical business deal that is developing into a financial crisis. Jesus, through the parable expresses a concern that we avert spiritual crisis through the practice of our faith and foresight. Jesus is pleading with us that if we expended as much foresight and energy to spiritual matters which have internal consequences in our lives as much as we do to attaining earthy riches which can have negative knockons in our lives we would be better off. We are reminded in today's Gospel that we are all servants of God and all that we own and possess belongs to him. God provides us with many gifts and in return he wants us to share these gifts with others. This will allow us to treasure in our lives what is most important. What does your heart treasure the most in life?

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.



USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will <u>not</u> need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-10 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 10 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*

As part of our learning in Geography Inquiry this term we went on an excursion to the Blue Mountains.



New directive from the Diocesan Office 25th May 2016

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).



You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module which can be found at this link.


This information was advised in your confirmation email towards the bottom of the page and can be easily missed. The link provided in your confirmation email from the Child Protection Team Catholic Education Office Parramatta was incorrect. Please use the abovementioned link.

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

Therefore in brief:

- 1. To complete form go to: http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au
- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email go to the link above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.



Dear friends,

As the Catholic Church in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains, the safety of children and other vulnerable people is our priority and a continual part of our ministry. The Diocese of Parramatta has systems of accountability and support to keep children and other vulnerable people safe. We continue to learn from mistakes of the past to improve our response today and into the future.

I am committed to ensuring our agencies and services in the Diocese of Parramatta are child safe environments. This includes having a rigorous recruitment screening and selection process for employees and volunteers. It includes having services and systems in place that identify behaviour of adults posing risks to the safety of those in our care. It includes ensuring we adhere to the legal requirements of New South Wales and Australia in responding and reporting any abuse. It means having a clear process for receiving, reporting and responding to any allegation or complaint that relates to the abuse of a

Within our services, children and vulnerable people must have a voice to inform our practices. These practices and systems within this Diocese extends to all its services and agencies including schools, CatholicCare Social Services, parishes,

agencies and

ministries.

This commitment cannot be done alone and I welcome the engagement of those who have experienced abuse in teaching us the way forward. We rely on our close working relationships with government and non-government agencies to always improve our approach to protecting the vulnerable.

All crimes against children and other vulnerable people are unacceptable. Any person with concerns or allegations of a criminal nature should report them directly to the NSW Police. If anyone has information or concerns about abuse they wish to bring to the attention of the Diocese this should be brought to the Diocesan Office for Safeguarding and Professional Standards.

An outline of relevant contacts and sources for further information and support, or how to make a eport, is included in this brochure.

I invite the people of the Diocese of Parramatta to work with me through our processes to ensure our Diocese is a safe environment for our children and vulnerable people. This is at the heart of our ministry now and for the future.

OSPS provides support and oversight to Catholic schools, parishes, CatholicCare Social Services and all other ministries of the Diocese in relation to practice and compliance in protecting children from abuse.

Its key functions are:

- Advice to ministry leaders
 - Education and prevention
- Outreach and support services to survivors of abuse
- Liaison and co-ordination of initiatives with other Dioceses
- Management of legal compliance including reports to external authorities
- Investigations into allegations made against Church personnel
- Liaison with government agencies including NSW Ombudsman, NSW Police, Family and Community Services, NSW Office of the Children's Guardian
- Audits and reviews
