### Opening School Mass postponed

Due to the extreme heat forecast for tomorrow, our Opening School Mass has been postponed to next Friday, 17th February at 9am.

We apologize for any inconvenience this has caused and thank you for your understanding.

Tomorrow is Census day for all schools across the state. This data-gathering day is a significant process that assists in the distribution of state funding for our schools. The data collected forms the basis of Recurrent Per Capita grants provided to the Diocese each year by both the Australian and State Governments. Part of the process involves schools providing a head count of the student population and details of students absent tomorrow regardless of the reason for their absence. Students are expected to be at school tomorrow as is the expectation each day. It is most important that if your child is absent from school tomorrow you must follow this up immediately on Monday next week with a written explanation for their absence.

ICAS is an independent, skills-based assessment program which recognises and rewards student achievement. ICAS is unique, being the most comprehensive generally available suite of academic assessments for primary and secondary school students. The assessments comprise of Digital Technologies, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing tests.

For more than 30 years, Educational Assessment Australia (EAA) has continuously improved and enhanced ICAS. Today, this experience means ICAS is a 21st century quality assessment the keeps pace with classroom learning.

A new ICAS test is developed annually for each subject in each year level by our team of subject matter experts. All ICAS tests are reviewed by experienced teachers to ensure that they accurately assess students' skills and are relevant to what they are learning at school. Some schools use ICAS as a psychometric test to better understand what students can and can't do at a point in time and track learning as students' progress from year to year. **Dear Parents** 

This year Christ the King will be registering all of our students for the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). This is a wonderful opportunity for you to encourage your child's reading and for your child to experience a variety of quality literature throughout the year. Students will have a reading log in their message folder, the back of their homework book or in their diary to keep a personal ongoing record of books read. The PRCID is the most important section to complete as this is the code you will use to enter your child's reading log onto the PRC website in Term 3. We ask that parents sign each entry once a book is finished, books read in class will be acknowledged by the class teacher. Although the Holy Faith Library has many of the books on the PRC lists, please visit your local libraries for extra books. Following is a summary of the PRC rules; visit the website for more information <a href="https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html">https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html</a>

- The Challenge runs from 6<sup>th</sup> March to 25th August 2017. Ongoing reading is encouraged.
- Students must complete a set amount of reading to meet the Challenge, see table below:

Challenge	Number of books needed to complete the Challenge	Minimum number of PRC books for your Challenge	Maximum number of personal choice books	PRC booklist selection	
K-2	30	25	5	K-2, 3-4	
3-4	20	15	5	3-4,5-6	
5-6	20	15	5	5-6, 7-9	

- Independent K-2 readers should attempt the 3-4 Challenge.
- To experience a book your child can listen to the book, participate in a shared reading of the book or read part or all of the book independently.

#### **Privacy Information**

It is a condition of entry that all students entering and successfully completing the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive an official PRC certificate and their names may appear on the PRC Gold and Platinum Honour Roll. Schools registering students must ensure that a parent/caregiver understands that all students entering the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive a PRC certificate and appear in the PRC Gold and Platinum Honour Roll. The certificate shows the student's name and school. Only the students' name will appear in the Gold and Platinum Honour Roll with no other identifying factors. Participating schools appear as a separate list and homeschools are not listed individually.

PASSWORDS will be issued at the beginning of Term 3. Until this time please use the Personal Reading Log at the back of your children's homework book, in their message folder or in their diary to record the title, author and PRC ID number of each book read. The PRC ID number can be found either on the title page of the book or from the PRC web site under book list.

It is parent's responsibility to ensure that each child's reading log is entered onto the official PRC website by the closing date of 25th August, 2017. Please watch for updates in the newsletter.

- · Students, whose online entries are received by the closing date of 25th August, 2017 will have their certificates sent to school in Term 4.
- · Students who complete the Challenge for four years receive a gold certificate., for seven year receive a platinum certificate.

#### **COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

#### Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

- 1-9 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date however, if travelling overseas an <u>Application for Extended Leave</u> form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach this application (for overseas travelonly).
- 10-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the <u>Application for Extended Leave</u> form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a <u>Certificate of Extended Leave</u>. If the principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

Skoolbag is the ultimate school to parent communication tool. This School Mobile App provides schools with an easy way to tell parents and carers important information as soon as it happens example: school news, event reminders, cancellations and much more.

#### HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.



#### USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- Complete all fields 4.
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-10 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 10 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.

#### BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> <u>ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

**Volunteers** – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <a href="www.parra.catholic.edu.au">www.parra.catholic.edu.au</a>, then click on the 'Volunteers and Contractors-Click here' image (halfway down page on the right hand side).

This image will take you to the Building Safe Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 1—Volunteer Form and follow the steps

#### You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

#### A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

# A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 2—Complete the Online Training Module

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

#### Therefore in brief:

- 1. To complete form go to: www.parra.catholic.edu.au and follow Step 1 above
- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.




