# The Blind Man John 9:1-41

During the 4<sup>th</sup> Week of Lent the gospel readings ask us to let the light of Christ shine on us. Like the man born blind, we are enlightened by Christ by bathing in the waters of baptism and opening our hearts and minds to the gospel that comes to us through the Christian community. The key question which Jesus asks the man is the same question which John's community asked those who wanted to become Christians: 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' To believe in the Son of Man is to recognise God's love in the love of Jesus who identified with the broken and the outcast and who, in Jesus, heard the cry of the poor. To believe in the Son of Man is to believe that God comes to us, in and through our weaknesses. The life of God comes to us through the cracks that seem to spoil our best-made plans and ambitions. It is where we haven't got everything together that the oil of God's gracious Spirit enters like balm to heal us. It is where there are breaks in our solid defences that the light streams through, where God walks with us, where he nourishes us with his love.





The practice of these emergency procedures is held to ensure that all our students and staff know the appropriate emergency response and are kept as safe as possible in the event of a fire. Students have been practicing the emergency procedures and after the event had an opportunity to discuss the drill with their teachers.

# The Earth Hour Story

Earth Hour launched in Sydney in 2007, with 2.2 million people and 2,100 businesses participating in the 'lights off' event. Just one year later, Earth Hour became a global phenomenon with over 35 countries, and an estimated 50-100 million people participating.

2017 will mark the 10th anniversary of Earth Hour as a global phenomenon. What started as an Aussie idea has grown into a global force of nature, that is now celebrated in over 172 countries and over 7,000 cities and towns worldwide. The symbolic hour has grown into the world's largest grassroots movement for the environment, with beyond-the-hour projects and initiatives happening throughout the year.

Earth Hour is a great home-grown success story: an Aussie campaign designed to draw attention to tackling global warming and get people talking about what we can do to help.

In Australia, Earth Hour is something that really brings communities together, with 1 in every 4 Aussies taking part. In 2016, millions of Australians took part in Earth Hour to show their support for a low pollution, clean energy future, one in which we can continue to enjoy the best of nature and our great Aussie outdoor lifestyle.

# 10 years of Earth Hour

In 2017, WWF is celebrating 10 years of Earth Hour and 10 years of progress on changing climate change.

We have come a long way in the last decade. Australian states and territories are now going full steam ahead with their ambitious targets for renewable energy. Right now about 1 in 7 Aussie households have solar panels installed on their roofs - we sure love our sun!

Earth Hour as a global movement has seen remarkable results. Last year the world came together to bridge our differences in a landmark global agreement in Paris to tackle climate change. We have seen 3.4 million hectares of marine parks protected in Argentina, an Earth Hour Forest in Uganda established, and a ban on plastic bags in the Galapagos Islands. Every individual voice, in chorus with the world during Earth Hour, has created an unstoppable momentum for our planet.

More than ever, our actions on climate change today will shape the future for our children. Since they were born, our children have been taught to be active recyclers, aware of renewable power alternatives, and informed about the effects of pollution on our planet. They know more about climate change than any other generation. And they have extraordinary views on what they want for their planet.

Yet our future is under threat from rising temperatures and more extreme weather. Small changes to our climate as a result of increased carbon pollution are messing up the delicate balance of nature that we enjoy so much.

# SACRAMENT OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION Parent Information night—Wednesday 29th March 7.30pm

In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy, we will be conducting the parishbased, family centred, school supported method of preparation for baptised Catholic children eligible to receive the next sacrament of initiation (First Holy Communion) into full membership of the Church.

Children who have already received the Sacrament of Reconciliation and whose families reside within our parish boundaries (or who worship regularly at Christ the King) are now eligible to receive the sacrament of Eucharist (First Holy Communion).

In the parish of Christ the King, the sacrament of First Holy Communion will be celebrated at the three parish masses on the weekend of 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup> June (the Feast of Corpus Christi).

The program for preparation to receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion will commence with an information meeting for parents / guardians (without children) on Wednesday, 29th March commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is essential that parents / guardians attend this meeting.



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- Complete all fields 4.
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

# This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-10 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 10 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.

#### BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

**Volunteers** – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <a href="www.parra.catholic.edu.au">www.parra.catholic.edu.au</a>, then click on the 'Volunteers and Contractors-Click here' image (halfway down page on the right hand side).

This image will take you to the Building Safe Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 1—Volunteer Form and follow the steps

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.


