I am very pleased to be able to return to school this week following four months of ill health. During that time I spent many days in hospital receiving treatment, surgery and many weeks recovering. My thanks to all members of our community for your best wishes and prayers during this time. They were greatly appreciated by both myself and family. It is great to be back working with all members of our CTK community. I would like to thank Mrs Bernadette Walsh who deputised for me during my absence. Her leadership and commitment enabled the school to function as normal. My thanks also to our school leadership team who all stepped up taking on additional duties and responsibilities during this period. Congratulations and thank you to all concerned.

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity. Understanding this phenomenon in our Catholic faith often proves difficult for a large proportion of people both young and old. In my reading this week I came across an anonymous explanation of the Holy Trinity by a theology student that resonated with my thinking and understanding of the Three Persons in the one God.

"You and I live in a three-dimensional world. All physical objects have a certain height, width, and depth. One person can look like someone else, or behave like someone else, or even sound like someone else. But a person cannot actually be the same as another person. They are distinct individuals. God, however, lives without the limitations of a three-dimensional universe. He is spirit, and he is infinitely more complex than we are. That is why Jesus the Son can be different from the Father, and, yet the same. The Bible clearly speaks of: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, but emphasizes that there is only ONE God. If we were to use math, it would not be, 1+1+1=3. It would be 1x1x1=1. God is a triune God. Thus the term: "Tri" meaning three, and "Unity" meaning one, Tri+Unity = Trinity. It is a way of acknowledging what the Bible reveals to us about God, that God is three "Persons" who have the same essence of deity. The sun is an analogy that can also be used to explain the Holy Trinity. From it we receive light, heat and radiation. Three distinct aspects, but only one sun. This is the same as the trinity, one God and three Persons-Father, Son and Holy Spirit."

Just a **reminder that next Monday is a Public Holiday**. Students will return to school on Tuesday 13th June.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

In the parish of Christ the King, the sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred on Wednesday, 30th August, 2017, commencing at 7.30pm. In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy we will conduct a parish-based, family centred, school supported method Confirmation of preparation for the children to receive this sacrament.

It is a prerequisite that children to be confirmed will have already received First Holy Communion. Children who were baptised in Eastern Rite (Uniate Churches, e.g. Maronite, Melchite, Ukranian, Chaldean etc.) may have already been confirmed at Baptism and will not need to participate in this programme.

Children in Year Five or above are eligible to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

The preparation programme for Confirmation will commence with an information meeting for parents / guardians on Thursday, 22nd June, commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

Back to School

It was a cold and blustery day, the kids were hiking to school .

They met a polar bear, who was looking very cool.

Hi there CTK community,

My name is Natalie Bertie, my son Ethan is in Year Two and daughter Emily will be starting Kindergarten next year at CTK. I am currently studying to become a Nutritional Therapy Practitioner, where I hope to support families towards recognising the importance of preparing nutrient dense whole foods. This includes understanding the benefits of having a balanced lifestyle (sleep, stress reduction, relaxation etc.) and supporting the nutritional needs of the body.

A component of my course requires me to submit a community based project which involves sharing my knowledge about nutrition. My aim is to support and encourage parents/carers with making healthier choices for themselves and their families. I have chosen to prepare some lunchbox recipe ideas that will be included in the weekly school newsletter throughout Term 3.

My family and I began our journey to better health three years ago starting with an overhaul of the food we were using to fuel our body. This led me to further investigate various health concerns my kids and I used to exhibit. These included asthma, allergies, poor sleep, food: fussiness; avoidance; and cravings, recurrent: colds; flu; and sinusitis, anxiety, inability to regulate emotions, inability to focus and concentrate, digestive issues and fluctuating energy levels throughout the day. I also struggled with low self-esteem and self-worth, obesity, moodiness and an inability to cope with everyday stress. I learned that the packaged and processed foods commonly eaten in society today, were negatively impacting our health.

With a change in food, we quickly began to see amazing improvements to our health and still continue to see remarkable improvements three years later. Our health gains have led to my new-found passion for nutritional therapy.

We all want to be feeding our families nourishing food which not only supports their growing bodies but also allows them to focus and concentrate, maintain consistent energy levels throughout the day and provide their brain with the fuel required to encourage them to be the individuals they strive to be.

Each recipe will include an 'Educational Eating' component and 'Tips 'n' Tricks' to support, inspire and empower parents/carers to *slowly* transition their family from a diet that relies on packaged and take-away foods of convenience, to a diet full of nutrient dense whole foods. This will nourish and support the body, allowing it to function to its full capacity. I will include skills and techniques to make this transitional process less overwhelming and achievable for those who are interested.

Please join me for afternoon tea (siblings of CTK students welcome) in the CTK library on Tuesday 27th June, at 2pm, to have a chat or ask questions and taste some of the lunchbox/snack recipes I will be including in the newsletter throughout Term 3. BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Click on Step 1—Volunteer Form and follow the steps

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change



A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.

Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 2—Complete the Online Training Module

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

Therefore in brief:

- 1. To complete form go to: www.parra.catholic.edu.au and follow Step 1 above
- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.


