Dear Parents.

This weekend Year 4 students from both our school and wider parish community will be making their First Eucharist. Over the last few weeks these children have been preparing with their parents and parish team as they prepare to receive our Lord through Holy Communion. We continue to pray for them and family during this most important time in their lives.

Celebrating our children's First Eucharist this Sunday on the Feast of The Body and Blood of Christ [Corpus Christi] is most significant, highlighting our dependence of the love fostered between ourselves and God our Father. Fr Michael highlights that "we are hungry and thirsty and we approach the table of the Lord and hold out our hands to receive the life-giving bread and to drink the life-giving wine." In simple language: God has made us for himself and we are hungry and thirsty to receive the life and the love which he offers us. Through our participation in the Holy Eucharist, we express our need and come to God to receive his most precious gift. Let us keep these thoughts in our prayers over the next few days as we pray for our first communicants.

Tonight our school choir will participate in the Diocesan Choral Festival "Captivate". Our choristers have been rehearsing for several weeks under the guidance of Mrs Collignon and are looking forward to performing with a number of other school from across the Parramatta Diocese. This is the hottest ticket in town with the performance being sold out yesterday. Please note that tickets will NOT be available for purchase at the door this evening.

Tomorrow your children will receive their first Semester reports. Please take the time to sit down with your children prior to their parent teacher interview over the next two weeks, acknowledging their achievements and discussing identified challenges for the second half of the year. It is a time to set attainable goals with your children in regards to their studies and what they can achieve over the next six months. I would like to thank the teachers for the many hours spent over recent weeks marking assessments and writing student reports. Information regarding the online parent teacher booking procedures was distributed last week. Please ensure you have made an appointment for an interview over the next two weeks. It is important that parents are punctual for their designated interview time. This will be greatly appreciated by staff and other parents.

The refurbishment of the parish hall has commenced this week. Your co-operation will be appreciated over the next few months as traffic conditions on the school site, parking and drop off and pick up procedures may be changed throughout the duration of the refurbishment programme. Hi there CTK community,

My name is Natalie Bertie, my son Ethan is in Year Two and daughter Emily will be starting Kindergarten next year at CTK. I am currently studying to become a Nutritional Therapy Practitioner, where I hope to support families towards recognising the importance of preparing nutrient dense whole foods. This includes understanding the benefits of having a balanced lifestyle (sleep, stress reduction, relaxation etc.) and supporting the nutritional needs of the body.

A component of my course requires me to submit a community based project which involves sharing my knowledge about nutrition. My aim is to support and encourage parents/carers with making healthier choices for themselves and their families. I have chosen to prepare some lunchbox recipe ideas that will be included in the weekly school newsletter throughout Term 3.

My family and I began our journey to better health three years ago starting with an overhaul of the food we were using to fuel our body. This led me to further investigate various health concerns my kids and I used to exhibit. These included asthma, allergies, poor sleep, food: fussiness; avoidance; and cravings, recurrent: colds; flu; and sinusitis, anxiety, inability to regulate emotions, inability to focus and concentrate, digestive issues and fluctuating energy levels throughout the day. I also struggled with low self-esteem and self-worth, obesity, moodiness and an inability to cope with everyday stress. I learned that the packaged and processed foods commonly eaten in society today, were negatively impacting our health.

With a change in food, we quickly began to see amazing improvements to our health and still continue to see remarkable improvements three years later. Our health gains have led to my new-found passion for nutritional therapy.

We all want to be feeding our families nourishing food which not only supports their growing bodies but also allows them to focus and concentrate, maintain consistent energy levels throughout the day and provide their brain with the fuel required to encourage them to be the individuals they strive to be.

Each recipe will include an 'Educational Eating' component and 'Tips 'n' Tricks' to support, inspire and empower parents/carers to *slowly* transition their family from a diet that relies on packaged and take-away foods of convenience, to a diet full of nutrient dense whole foods. This will nourish and support the body, allowing it to function to its full capacity. I will include skills and techniques to make this transitional process less overwhelming and achievable for those who are interested.

Please join me for afternoon tea (siblings of CTK students welcome) in the CTK library on Tuesday 27th June, at 2pm, to have a chat or ask questions and taste some of the lunchbox/snack recipes I will be including in the newsletter throughout Term 3. THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

In the parish of Christ the King, the sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred on Wednesday, 30th August, 2017, commencing at 7.30pm. In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy we will conduct a parish-based, family centred, school supported method of preparation for the children to receive this sacrament.

It is a prerequisite that children to be confirmed will have already received First Holy Communion. Children who were baptised in Eastern Rite (Uniate Churches, e.g. Maronite, Melchite, Ukranian, Chaldean etc.) may have already been confirmed at Baptism and will not need to participate in this programme.

Children in Year Five or above are eligible to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

The preparation programme for Confirmation will commence with an information meeting for parents / guardians on Thursday, 22nd June, commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered as well as enrolment forms distributed.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

- Open Skoolbag app 1.
- Click on eForms 2.
- Select Absentee Form 3.
- 4. Complete all fields
- In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen 5.
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-10 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 10 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.

CHANGES TO STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) **COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Click on Step 1—Volunteer Form and follow the steps

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

• For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.

Click on Step 2—Complete the Online Training Module

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

Therefore in brief:

- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.


