Dear Parents.

Over the next few weeks I will be interviewing parents and children who are seeking enrolment for Kindergarten for 2019. If you have not already completed / submitted an enrolment form for Kindergarten next year and have not scheduled an interview appointment, please do so by the end of next week.

Families who have finalised this first step of the enrolment process will receive notification of 'Acceptance of Enrolment' by the end of June. If you know of other families wishing to enrol their children in Kinder or other grades at CTK for 2019 please pass on this enrolment information

As part of showcasing our children's learning we will be commence assemblies for 2018 on designated Friday afternoons. The assemblies will commence at 2pm and will run for some 20-30 minutes. For the remainder of 2018, each grade will present their learning at one assembly. Our Year 6 leadership team will host and run each of these assemblies which will include Scripture and Prayer, acknowledgment of country, our school song and most importantly an opportunity for the children of the designated grade to share and showcase the learning that has taken place leading up to the assembly. Parents are invited to attend these assemblies and share in the great learning that is happening in our learning spaces each and every day. Awards will continue to be presented at the recess assembly on Friday mornings so the focus can be on showcasing our student's learning.

Our first assembly will be hosted by Year 4 on Friday 8th June commencing at 2pm in the hall. We look forward to seeing you then.

Next weekend Year 4 students from both our school and wider parish community will be making their First Eucharist. Over the last few weeks these children have been preparing with their parents and parish team as they prepare to receive our Lord through Holy Communion. We continue to pray for them and family during this most important time in their lives.

Celebrating our children's First Eucharist whilst also celebrating the Feast of The Body and Blood of Christ [Corpus Christi] (Sunday 3rd June) is most significant, highlighting our dependence of the love fostered between ourselves and God our Father.

next week as we pray for our first communicants.

Leadership at State Parliament House

On the 23rd of May, we went travelled by bus to the State Parliament of NSW. When we arrived at Parliament House we met others schools in our area such as Oakhill College, St Angela's and North Rocks Public School. While we were at the House we passed a debate about a bill that was being held in the Chamber.

When got to the courtyard at Parliament House we met a lot of Politicians and Ministers, such as Gladys Berejiklian the Premier of NSW. Her job is to look after our state and keep our state of NSW, a safe place for everyone to live and learn. We met Politicians and Ministers that care for us like David Elliot who is Head of Counter Terrorism, Rob Stokes the Education Minister, Troy Grant and Peter Sevilan the Chief Police and Minister of the Police Services and Prisons in NSW. According to David Elliot, our mothers will know Ray Williams; the head of Castle Towers Shopping Centre. We also met a Japanese Ambassador called John Dowd that taught us some martial arts (especially karate and sumo wrestling).

With these important people we discussed different leadership qualities and what qualities are necessary in their jobs. We spoke to Mr. Sevilan (Head of the Police and Prisons across NSW) and he said that his role as leader needs to possess courage, bravery and taking control of situations. David Elliot said most of the ministers, including himself, began as Leaders in their primary or high school, they were either School Captains, Vice Captains, Prefects or people who were a part of the student leadership team.

After about an hour later, we left NSW Parliament and departed Sydney by bus and arrived safely back to school.

We know, after all, that NAPLAN is one way of assessing Literacy and Numeracy skills but does not give us a complete picture of what your child can do, the creative, inquisitive, socially skilled or independent learner your child is developing into. I thank you and our talented staff for keeping all these experiences in perspective and respecting the uniqueness of each individual child at Christ the King.

SEMESTER 1 REPORTS

The staff here at Christ the King have been working together to write your children's school reports and planning the parent/teacher interviews which are to take place in Weeks 9, 10 (Term 2). These meetings are opportunities for you to share in your children's learning experiences and a time to ask the questions that you wish to have answered regarding your child's learning and well-being. It is always important to speak to the teachers about any concerns you may have and especially to clarify any thoughts you may have about the class routines, structures or learning that takes place concerning your child.



Showbag If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.

USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.

STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change
