Mr Matthews will be taking the time to share his expertise as Literacy Coordinator at CTK on Wednesday Aug 27th from 5-6pm.



Voice of Youth Competition 2014



On Monday, 18th August 2014, our Year 6 students visited St Monica's School for the annual Voice of Youth Public Speaking Competition. This competition has been held within the Parramatta Diocese for more than 25 years and provides students with a flair for public speaking to showcase their talents to a wider audience.

After developing and fine-tuning their speeches throughout the term, our 3 finalists from Christ the King were determined after rounds of heats and finals. The talent amongst our Year 6 students was of a high standard and choosing our 3 competitors for the Voice of Youth Competition was certainly not an easy task. **Gabby Bovino, Alyssa Lubrano and Daniel Spurr** were chosen to represent CTK and compete against students from St Mary's Rydalmere, St Bernadette's Dundas and St Monica's North Parramatta.

Alyssa Lubrano was the first speaker of all the 12 competitors, which would have been nerve wracking for most, but she presented her speech "Aubrey Laidlaw....an Aussie Icon" with confidence and enthusiasm. Daniel Spurr presented second for CTK with his speech "#social media", which discussed our obsession with social media and the negative and positive effects of current technology. Gabby Bovino's speech "If I ruled the world..." addressed the state of the world today and provided excellent suggestions for how we can overcome poverty, war and injustice.

All of the 12 competitors were of a high standard and the competition extremely close. We congratulate Daniel Spurr for winning the "Social Justice Award" for 2014. Well done also to Alyssa and Gabby for their efforts and personal achievements, we are extremely proud of all our competitors in this year's Voice of Youth Competition!



Tournament of Minds 2014



On Sunday, 24th August 2014, a team of 7 students will compete in the 2014 Tournament of Minds Competition. The TOM Competition is one of the fastest growing national inter-school programs to challenge the youth of Australia and provides an opportunity for students with a passion for learning and problem solving to demonstrate their skills and talents in an exciting, vibrant and public way.

The team who will represent CTK at the Western Sydney Division Finals includes Tamsyn Brown, Alyssa Lubrano, Daniel Spurr and Angelina Wehbe of Year 6 and Marcus Georges, Alex Nielson and Jakob Reid of Year 5.

Our team was required to work together on a *Long Term Challenge* for the past six weeks, with 3 hours being dedicated to the challenge outside of school hours each week. Our team selected to solve the Social Sciences Challenge, which called for "The removal of the cultural symbol of the Emu from Australia to Sweden". They were encouraged to explore possibilities and experiment with ideas in order to produce the best possible solution with limited materials – all props and costumes had to be hand made within an extremely tight budget.

Our team will present their challenge solution – an International Court of Justice drama - to a panel of judges and audience at the University of Western Sydney, Kingswood Campus. They have ten minutes in which to present and must do so within a 3 metre by 3 metre performance area.

The CTK team will also participate in an unseen *Spontaneous Challenge* on the day. This challenge requires the rapid interchange of ideas; the ability to think creatively and well developed group cooperation skills, which our team has been diligently working towards.

We wish our TOM team great success this Sunday and look forward to reporting our achievements to you next week.

Father's Day update


