CTK Christmas Concert 2018 - Costumes

Please read carefully your child's costume outline.

Kindergarten Christmas Concert Costumes

Boys - denim shorts and a plain white T-shirt (no patterns or print)

Girls - denim shorts or skirt and a plain white T shirt (no patterns or print. Hair tied back in one neat ponytail.

All children-tinsel on wrists, white sandshoes and white socks

Year 1 Christmas Concert Costumes

All children in plain white t shirt (no pictures or print), shorts or skirt in red, green or silver (may have patterns), white socks and sandshoes.

Girls - hair in 1 neat ponytail at the back of their heads.

All children to have a set of reindeer antlers - any kind.

Year 2 Christmas Concert Costumes

Girls – All girls are to wear a pretty dress, with silver, gold or tan sandals and hair in high pigtails with ribbons tied in a bow.

Boys – All boys are to wear grey school shorts with a button up shirt or a polo shirt, white socks, black school shoes and hair spiked up.

Year 3 Christmas Concert Costumes

All students: All black clothes (pants, shorts, t-shirt, skirts or a dress) with no other colours/images or prints, an akubra hat or straw hat for the second song and any shoes they like.

Girls are advised to wear a hairstyle that will not interfere with wearing a hat.

Year 4 Christmas Concert Costumes

The "Elves Presleys"

All students wear:

Elf hat with ears. (hair should be styled as to not interfere with the hat).

LIBRARY NEWS

Six strategies for connecting boys with books



Here are six strategies you can use to connect boys with books and increase their reading engagement:

- 1. just as your interests and views are not identical to all those of the same age and gender, boys have diverse interests and tastes. These don't necessarily stay static over time. To match them with reading material they're really interested in, initiate regular discussions about reading for pleasure, in order to keep up with their interests
- 2. access to books is essential to promote reading, take your boys to the library and let them choose books
- 3. keep reading to and with boys for as long as possible, as many boys find it enjoyable and beneficial beyond the early years
- 4. provide opportunities and expectations for silent reading at home, despite competing demands on time
- 5. keep paper books available. Boys who are daily readers are even less likely to choose to read on screens than girls. The assumption that boys prefer to read on screens is not supported by research
- 6. promote reading as an enjoyable and acceptable pastime by being a great role model. Let your children see you read for pleasure.



Year 1 Maths

We have learnt how to count using arrays.

We can calculate large and smaller numbers by counting the number of rows and how many in each row.

It's much faster and we are becoming very good at finding arrays and calculating the total number of the group.



Today we wanted to make a human array.

First we went into groups of 3 and then 4.

But we found that some children were left out.


We tried 5 and it was an equal share and no one was left out.

Then we made 11 rows of 5 children in each row.

We calculated that there were 55 children in our room at the time.

Then someone else came, so we knew that we now had 56 children. We needed to rearrange the rows to make 56.

We tried 6 in each group but it wasn't an equal share.



We made 7 rows of 8 children and then made 8 rows of 7 children.


Both times we had equal shares and no one was left out.

Next time when all of our class are together we will need to try 57.

I wonder how many rows and how many children in each row?

That could be tricky!

We then found more arrays in our classroom.



This chart has 4 rows of 3. That's 12 boxes



Then we found our water bottles were placed in an array of 3 rows of 3.


There were 9 water bottles in the basket.



Our Van Gogh paintings were arranged in rows of 2. This group has 5 rows so we can see 10.




Our tubs are in 4 rows with 4 in each row. That equals 16 tubs altogether.



We found the dots on the Appraisa Apple TV were in 5 rows of 4.

There were 20 coloured dots in total.

There were also 10 rows of numbers and each row has 10 so that equals 100.



The basket had 4 rows of 10 holes. We calculated there were 40 holes on this side of the basket. How many holes if there are 40 on all 4 sides of the basket?

We've learnt lots of mathematical words and the special words for this maths is

multiplication and division

IMPORTANT MESSAGE RE CHANGES TO GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS.

Dear Parents.

Children should always be fully aware of their going home arrangements before they come to school each day.

Notification of any changes to your child's going home arrangements <u>must be phoned through to the school</u> <u>office before midday</u>. Messages received after this time are passed on with much difficulty due to assemblies and classes being held in various places on the school grounds.

PLEASE NOTE: A phone message left on the School Answering machine will NOT be accepted. Parents must speak with an Office Staff member to ensure that the message has been received.

Email messages are not recommended, however, if absolutely necessary, an email can be sent to the school re changes to arrangements and if received by the school you will be sent an email acknowledgement. If you have not received an acknowledgement, then please assume that your email has not been received. In this case, your child's normal going home arrangement will still apply.

HAVE YOU DOWNLOADED THE Skoolbag App YET?



Skoolbag is the ultimate school to parent communication tool. This School Mobile App provides schools with an easy way to tell parents and carers important information as soon as it happens example: school news, event reminders, cancellations and much more.

To install it, just search for our school name "Christ the King Primary North Rocks" in either the Apple App Store, Google Play Store or on Windows.

HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app



If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.

USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will <u>not</u> need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*

STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.


Parents and their daughters have the opportunity to tour the school campus at one of our upcoming school tours specifically for Year 7 2020 applicants, but open to any year group.
