This Sunday's Gospel quotes one of Christ's most profound teachings: "Love your enemies. do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly." 
LIBRARY NEWS

Premier's Reading Challenge 2019

Once again all CTK students will be registered for the Premier's Reading Challenge 2019. Books in our library that are on the PRC list have the sticker on the spine to indicate which level they are and on the first page the PRC ID, which is needed when entering read books into the website in Term 3. Please ask your children where their PRC Reading Record is (bright yellow sheet). It should be in their home work book, message folder or diary. Encourage your child to complete the challenge, reading for pleasure is one of the best ways to improve your child's learning. Attached to this newsletter are the rules and instructions for the PRC, please contact me through the school office if you have any questions.

Subscription Information

Every student at CTK has a Mathletics and Reading Eggs subscription. Their log in details are in their home work book, diary or message folder. These subscriptions are a fun way for your children to play games and learn at the same time. Try requesting that they complete 15 minutes of Reading Eggs before they play some other game on the device. This year Christ the King will be registering all of our students for the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). This is a wonderful opportunity for you to encourage your child's reading and for your child to experience a variety of quality literature throughout the year. Students will have a reading log in their message folder, the back of their homework book or in their diary to keep a personal ongoing record of books read. The PRCID is the most important section to complete as this is the code you will use to enter your child's reading log onto the PRC website in Term 3. We ask that parents sign each entry once a book is finished, books read in class will be acknowledged by the class teacher. Although the Holy Faith Library has many of the books on the PRC lists, please visit your local libraries for extra books. Following is a summary of the PRC rules; visit the website for more information https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html

The Challenge runs till the 30 August 2019. Ongoing reading is encouraged.

Students must complete a set amount of reading to meet the Challenge, see table below:

Challenge	Number of books needed to complete the Challenge	Minimum number of PRC books for your Challenge	Maximum number of personal choice books	PRC booklist selection
K-2	30	25	5	K-2, 3-4
3-4	20	15	5	3-4,5-6
5-6	20	15	5	5-6, 7-9

- Independent K-2 readers should attempt the 3-4 Challenge.
- In a series on the PRC booklist, you can read any two books as PRC books. You can read up to five other books from the same series as Personal Choice books.
- To experience a book your child can listen to it, participate in a shared reading of the book or read part or all of the book independently.

Privacy Information

It is a condition of entry that all students entering and successfully completing the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive an official PRC certificate and their names may appear on the PRC Gold and Platinum Honour Roll. Schools registering students must ensure that a parent/caregiver understands that all students entering the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive a PRC certificate and appear in the PRC Gold and Platinum Honour Roll. The certificate shows the student's name and school. Only the students' name will appear in the Gold and Platinum Honour Roll with no other identifying factors. Participating schools appear as a separate list and homeschools are not listed individually.

PASSWORDS will be issued at the beginning of Term 3. Until this time please use the Personal Reading Log at the back of your children's homework book, in their message folder or in their diary to record the title, author and PRC ID number of each book read. The PRC ID number can be found either on the title page of the book or from the PRC website under book list.

It is parent's responsibility to ensure that each child's reading log is entered onto the official PRC website by the closing date of 30th August, 2019. Please watch for updates in the newsletter.

Students, whose online entries are received by the closing date of 30th August, 2019 will have their certificates sent to school in Term 4.

Students who complete the Challenge for four years receive a gold certificate and for seven years they receive a platinum certificate.


Just like that it was over and we were back at school in a jiffy

The phone box is ringing And it was the Queen, She loved hearts of course, But being lovable isn't really Her specialty, it is more The opposite....You know


My Luscious lipstick was lovely,



Whole School Reward System



CTK uses a whole school reward system that works across all students from all grades and is in place all the time.

- Staff award individual students with "tokens" when they observe them making positive choices that clearly reflect the three school rules - Care For Self, Care For Others and Care For The Environment.
- The number of tokens received by each student is recorded and tracked over time.
- When a student reaches a specified number of tokens, they receive a merit certificate.
 20=In class reward, 100=Bronze Award, 200=Silver Award, 300=Gold Award, 400=Diamond Award
- Students who achieve an award at each level will also gain access to "Merit Events".
 For example: Principals morning tea, ice blocks etc
- All teachers will use the token system on the playground, in the classroom and in all other aspects of school life, such as after school dismissal areas, excursions, assemblies etc.

Parent helpers - please let us know if you are able to assist with organisation and supervision on the day of the


carnival. In order to maximise the participation of all the children, we ask that parents help out wherever they can. There is parking at the reserve.

USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- Select Absentee Form 3.
- 4. Complete all fields
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- Press Submit 6

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.

STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> <u>ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.






