# Dear Parents

During Lent we are encouraged to pray more intently and fast. Prayer is part of everyday life for all of us and something that we are encouraged to participate in with God regularly. Fasting however is an action in which we are encouraged to partake during the season of Lent. So what is 'fasting'? Fr Michael Fallon a scriptural Australian Scholar summarises what fasting is in the following extract from his homily for this Sunday. Fasting means going without. It means a change of routine. It focuses our attention on the external habits into which we have grown, and by denying some attraction, we keep reminding ourselves that our real hunger and need is for God. This is the idea behind giving up something for Lent. It is not so much doing without some special food or drink or luxury. It is so that when we do without it we will be reminded of God. It is a good idea to make a small prayer each time we fast. So as we journey throughout next week let us focus on the need for God in our lives and 'fast' from those things in life that distract us from a prayerful connection with our Lord. Let's reach out to others and make a difference in their lives.

The Diocese of Parramatta will be conducting a parent retreat on Wednesday 1st May, 2019.

This will be a day of relaxation for parents that will be held at St Joseph's Spirituality Centre, Baulkham Hills from 9.30am - 2.30pm. # SACRAMENT OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy, we will be conducting the parish-based, family centred, school supported method of preparation for baptised Catholic children eligible to receive the next sacrament of initiation (First Holy Communion) into full membership of the Church.



Children who have already received the Sacrament of Reconciliation and whose families reside within our parish boundaries (or who worship regularly at Christ the King) are now eligible to receive the sacrament of Eucharist (First Holy Communion).

In the parish of Christ the King, the sacrament of First Holy Communion will be celebrated at the three parish masses on the weekend of  $22^{\text{nd}}/23^{\text{rd}}$  June (the Feast of Corpus Christi).

The program for preparation to receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion will commence with an information meeting for parents/guardians (without children) on Wednesday,  $27^{\rm th}$  March commencing at 7.30pm in Christ the King Church, where the program and enrolment procedure will be explained and any questions answered.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is **essential** that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

Enrolment packages for 2020 are now available. Sibling enrolments forms have been sent home.

Parent/Student enrolment meetings will commence in early May and continue throughout June.


Previous Maths Challenge - What 'maths' can you see in the picture?





# The shapes and maths signs on the basketball court are:


- → Brackets in the shooting area. Brackets can be used in a sum like this: 3 +(3 X 7)=24.
- → Another is the x and+ sign in the handball court. X and + can be used like this: 13 + 13 = 26 & 13 x 2= 26.
- → The basketball court outlined by the yellow and blue lines is a rectangle.
- → There is a circle in the very middle of the basketball court.
- → There are rectangle bricks and rectangle tiles above the stairs.
- → The line in between the shooting area circle can be resembled as a minus sign. The minus sign can be used in this case: 39 -13 =26.
- → There are 4 right angles on each handball square. The right angles are in the inner corners of the handball square.
- → All the lines that cut the 3 circles in half, as shown on the photo of the basketball court, represent the diameter of the circles, which is the measurement of the inside length of the circle from one end to the other. If the diameter of the circle is divided by 2 or cut in half we then know the radius of the circle.
- → The circles that are cut in half represent a line of symmetry. A line of symmetry is like a mirror reflection, on one side there is a semi circle and the other side there is a semi circle.
- → There are parallel lines on the side of the yellow and blue rectangle of the basketball court. There are also parallel lines inside the basketball court. Parallel lines never meet like train tracks.







- When we play games... we are gentle and do not play rough.











Year 4

# USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen 5.
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

# This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.

# STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

## Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e.: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

# BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.
